SPEND MILLION FOR MISSIONS

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—The general missionary committee of the Methodist Episcopal church met in annual session today at James Methodist Episcopal church, Brooklyn. The feature of the day was the report of Dr. Homer Eaton, treasurer of the missionary society, which showed that the society had received during the year ending Oct 31 the sum of \$1,582,215, an increase over the receipts of the previous year \$145,578.

CANADA REVISITED FUTURE ASSURED

LONDON, Nov. 9.—With Lord Strathcona as chairman, Sir Gilbert Parker, M. P. delivered a lecture on "Canada After Twenty Years." In giving a review of the development of the country, Sir G. Parker said there is no longer any national uncertainty as to Canada's future; it is that of national expansion under the British flag with complete control of internal affairs, but sharing in the general responsibility of the Empire and its general necessities.

NEW BRITISH CARDINAL LIKELY.

ROME, Nov. 9.—At the Vatican, it is now considered very probable that the Most Rev. Francis Bourne, archbishop of Westminster, will be chosen as the fifth cardinal to be appointed at the next consistory.

QUARREL ENDS IN PROBABLE MURDER

Stones Thrown at Door of Two Colored Peaceable Men Who Afterwards Meet Those Annoying Them and Bloodshed Results

HALIFAX, Nov. 12.—(Special)—As the result of a desperate quarrel among able-bodied men at Bridgetown last night Abraham Marsden, colored, is lying at the point of death. He and his brother Ezekiel, peaceable citizens and members of the Salvation Army, were annoyed last night by Henry and Joseph Devany, who threw rocks at their door.

DRUG COMBINE WONT INCREASE PRICES

They will Alter Credit System and Prevent those Without Capital Selling at Reduced Prices.

MONTREAL, Nov. 12.—(Special)—A statement has been issued on behalf of the new wholesale drug combine that prices will not be increased, the present profits being considered adequate when expenses are reduced. The credit system will be altered as under old methods anyone without capital might open a shop, to secure his supplies and sell at reduced prices.

A COUNTESS IS DIVORCED

DETROIT, Mich., Nov. 10.—The Countess De Szilassy, formerly Louisa May Hecker, daughter of Col. Frank J. Hecker, of this city, was yesterday granted a divorce by the circuit court of this county from Count Gyula Hope Joseph De Szilassy, on grounds of desertion and non support. The couple were married in 1898, when the count was secretary of the Austrian legation at Washington.
