TAX EXEMPTIONS.

Most persons know in a general way that certain buildings, institutions and industries in Charlottetown enjoy an exemption from taxation, but few are probably aware of the assessed value of these properties or the large aggregate which they represent. We do not tax the property of the Dominion Government within the City, and we have one exceedingly good reason for the exemption in the fact that we have no power. The like rule applies to Provincial Government property. As for the public buildings and property of the City itself they are not taxed because they are in effect the common property of the citizens, and if such property were taxed the money would be only taken out of one pocket to put it into the other.

Church buildings and property, come within another class, and as our people are nearly all church goers, the question of abolishing the exemption of such property has scarcely been mooted here, while in some other cities it has been much agitated. There is still another class of property, that of the so-called new industries, the exemption of which as a matter of public policy has formed a subject of frequent discussion in the press, the City Council and the Legislature. The need of laying down some well understood principle applicable to all such cases is apparent. Where a special case is made of each new industry, the different composition of the City Council at different times, and other causes, are almost certain to lead to one industry being treated with greater consideration than another equally deserving, and in this way injustice is likely to result.

So much being premised it will be of interest to note the different properties that are exempted from taxation and the assessed value thereof. The following is a list of them:

A western correspondent writes that the Minister of Railways has given assurance that two trains will be continued in the western end of Prince County winter and summer. The people of that section are much delighted with this result of the earnest agitation kept up for two years past. Father Burke, A. J. McFadgen of Fignish and Joseph Read M. L. A. are mentioned as having been active in this work, and Hon. A. G. Blair is heartily commended. He writes that "he desires to have the service as efficient as possible." Some previous Ministers of Railways, our correspondent says, "didn't give a rap for Prince Edward Island," but the present Minister takes an interest in our affairs.
