**CENTRAL CHRISTIAN CHURCH**

Sunday services were featured by hearty anthems by the choir and pointed and eloquent sermons by the Rev. Morgan E. Genge, Ph.D., D. D.

The morning anthem was that beautiful production of Normans, "Light of the Lonely Pilgrim's Heart" in the evening the anthem was "This Holy Hour" by Adams and was well rendered.

The morning's text was Rev. 6-9-11. The preacher in speaking on the purpose of the Book of Revelation pointed out the value of that Book in terms of today, in terms of all the history of the Church and in vivid fashion, set forth the struggle of the saints through tears and blood to the altar, which, to-day, calls for judgment and reward. The cry of the saints, who have been slain for the testimony of Jesus must be answered, and the bird of the saints cries out, "to-day, for that judgment, which will as certainly be met as day follows night."

In the evening Dr. Genge preached from the text Isaiah 11:10 "And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall Gentiles seek; and his rest shall be glorious."

The Doctor's subject was "The Spiritual Significance of the Flag And The Attempt To Bring In A New Flag."

The preacher said in part—"In all history there has been no flag more sacred and more significant than the ensign of Old Britain. Whichever its folds have been flung to the breeze the British flag has stood for power and liberty—the liberty of all peoples and all nations small and great. The red of its Jack has been dyed by the blood of immortals both on land and on sea."

"We have woefully missed, in our day, and generation, the spiritual conception of our Flag. We have missed the Crosses of Saint Andrew and Saint Patrick—blazoned on our ships and hospitals. What Crosses do you ask? The Crosses of Saint George, Saint Andrew and Saint Patrick—mean to you and to me and to every red-blooded Canadian no matter where born or what his genealogical tree may have been? The answer is plain. He who runs may read. The union of the British Empire that for flung Patrie—that is going to stand against all these vain and short-lived attempts to bring in a new flag, a new ensign, which is neither Can-
