CO-OPERATIVE SELLING OF WOOL

The Co-operative selling of wool was very successful last year and to further the movement grading will, this year, be carried on at Charlottetown and Summerside. Samples will be sent to the manufacturers and the entire amount tendered for. In this way, all that the wool is worth on the open market will be received, and by co-operating with the manufacturer all will be benefited.

Wool will be taken in at both places, commencing June 12th. On June 15th, 18th, and 17th, Mr. Thompson, the wool expert, will be in Charlottetown to discuss any question that may arise. Grading will be carried on June 19th, 20th and 21st. If the 105th Battalion vacates the Agricultural Hall, the wool will be stored there. If not arrangements for storage nearby will be made, and in either case, information can be had at the Agricultural Hall. All wool for Char-

Mr. Thompson will be at Summerside on June 12th, 13th, and 14th, to discuss the wool question, but grading there will not commence until June 22nd, and will continue during the 23rd and 24th. At Summerside the wool will be taken in at the Agricultural Hall, and should be addressed to W. J. Reid. The experiment was successful last year, and the co-operation of every farmer is asked for. Do not wash the wool; do not tie it with binder twine; tie each fleece separately; ship in a hard sack or oil sheet; be sure that every parcel is labelled properly.

EDICT ISSUED AGAINST EYEGLASSES. LONDON, June 1.—A warning against the unnecessary wearing of spectacles and eyeglasses by soldiers has been issued by the general in command of the eastern district, which includes the Canadians. The order points out that this is a bomb and rifle grenade war, and that keen sight in every soldier is not absolutely necessary. It is further pointed out that in wet weather spectacles become blurred and a source of trouble to men of the ranks.
