DANGERS OF THE MANCHURIAN PLAGUE.

For weeks past telegraphic advices from the outside world have contained frequent references to the terribly destructive ravages of the plague in Manchuria.

Streams of Chinese laborers in flight carried the infection into China and Mongolia. In the meantime some form of plague exists among the rats and rabbits of eastern England.

Either bubonic or pneumonic plague is a fearfully fatal malady, but the latter is the more so. In India the mortality from bubonic plague has been about 80 per cent. and in Europe about 30 per cent.

The Times in no alarmist spirit points out that the presence of the plague bacillus among the rats and rabbits in England is "of far more immediate importance than the daily horrors which are reported from the Far East."

WHY WE FAVOR RECIPROCITY.

At the great Liberal convention of 1893 which laid down the platform of the party two planks were especially conspicuous. One of these pronounced against high protective duties, and the other expressed the desire of the party for reciprocal trade with the United States.

For these reasons, and with a somewhat belated conviction that by the two adroit measures referred to a great advance toward tariff reform and reduction has been made, in a manner that will give the least shock and the least possible grounds of complaint to the manufacturing industries of Canada.

Protection was then very strongly entrenched, possibly too strongly to be met by a direct frontal attack.

The Guardian, which has consistently and from strong conviction opposed the high protective duties as based upon an unsound principle, inimical to the best interests of the Maritime Provinces, and especially of Prince Edward Island, contemplates some natural impatience because the high tariff was maintained so long by the party in power.
