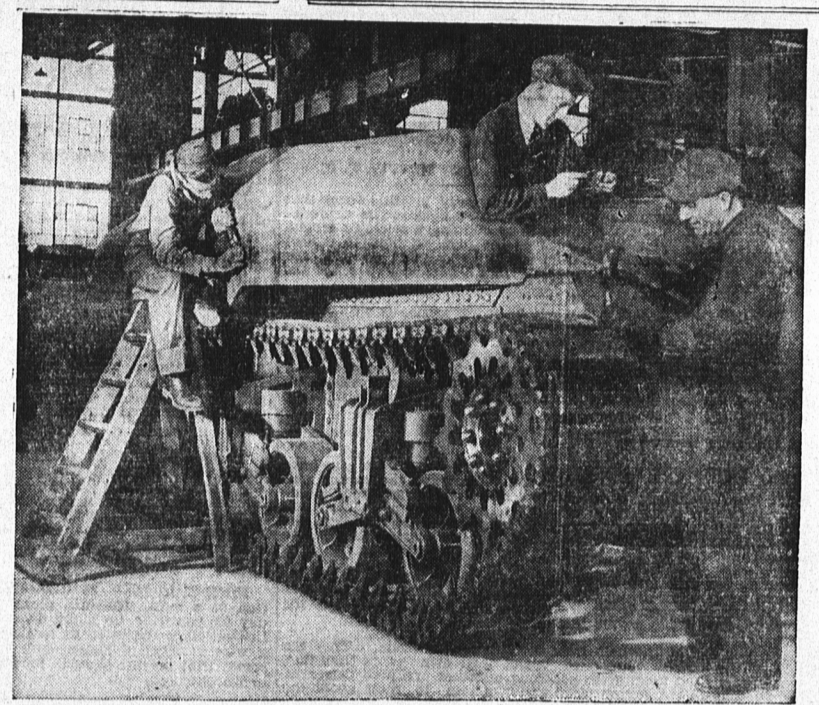

Japs may block U. S. shipments To Russians

TOKYO, July 4 (AP)—Japan is considering an extension of the limits of her territorial waters which, in effect, would cut off Vladivostok, Russia's big Pacific port, from normal contact with the rest of the world and hamper any shipments of United States material to the warring U.S.S.R.

German correspondents induced Koh Ishii, cabinet spokesman, to make this positive disclosure in a press conference today.

"Of course," Ishii replied, "but the question has not been decided."

Ishii indicated that the Government was seriously considering the possibility of United States aid shipments to Russia via Vladivostok, on the Sea of Japan, which is all but enclosed by the huge arc of the Japanese islands.

At the same time the newspaper Hoch commented:— "If the United States sends arms and munitions to the Soviet, by virtue of the all-out aid lease-lend law, they must pass through Japanese waters enroute to Vladivostok."

"This means that Germany must apply tripartite tactics. The war thus would be extended to Japanese"

Hear Turks Refuse Vichy Troops Passage

ISTANBUL, Turkey, July 4 (AP)—Turkish quarters which usually are well informed, heard tonight that President Inonu not only had refused German-backed demands for passage of Vichy troops and munitions to Syria, but had received information that there might be internal complications in Germany because of the Russian campaign.

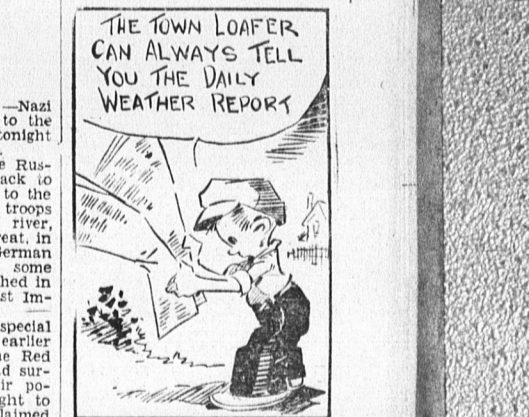
