The ammunition used will be the Lee-Enfield Carbine. In the Magazine Firing the targets will be exposed one minute only. All members will be in uniform. The large targets will be used throughout.

In congratulating Rev. Mr. Ireland up on the announcement of his engagement to Miss Winslow, of Fredericton, the Woodstock Dispatch says:—The Rev. G. D. Ireland was born in Alberton (P. E. I.), and was educated at Prince of Wales College, McGill University, the Presbyterian College, Montreal, and the Divinity School of the University of Chicago. He was ordained and inducted into the pastorate of St. Paul's Presbyterian church, Woodstock, in December, 1898. Mr. Ireland is an authority on Biblical and English literature and is a strong preacher and lecturer. He is an able organizer and the valuable faculty of interesting young men in church work.

Mr. Ireland's classes in Browning and Tennyson held in the vestry of his church during two winters, were attended by adherents and members of many other churches beside his own. He implanted and cultivated in the hearts of many people a love for the best English literature which they can never forget and for which they will always be grateful to him. He also organized literary classes for the younger people whom he greatly interested in literary work, by this means making it impossible that they can ever find enjoyment in cheap literature and ensuring that all their readings will be of a high order. Since he came to Woodstock he has raised St. Paul's church from an augmented charge to a self sustaining church and under his pastorate the membership and the congregation have largely increased. His broad sympathies and earnestness have drawn people to him and enabled him to accomplish his work. Mr. Ireland was the organizer of the Woodstock Golf Club, of the local branch of the Book Lovers' Library and was one of the chief promoters of the Caletton County Hospital, of which he is a director and trustee. He is a member of the Alpha Delta Phi Fraternity, McGill chapter. He is also a prominent member of the Masonic order and is at present senior warden of his mother lodge and grand chaplain of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Mr. Ireland is recognized by the clergymen as one of the ablest and most earnest of the younger men in the Presbyterian ministry in the maritime provinces and his many warm friends see before him a future helpful to others and honorable to himself. The Dispatch extends hearty congratulations to Mr. Ireland and Miss Winslow.

EASTERN NOTES—Continued. The weather is going to give us a short dry crop, which was by no means promising from first. The potato crop looks well, the bug is conspicuous for his absence, only three farmers in this section having any.
