Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Aug. 14 (AP)—Traders in grain futures markets went about their business today on the basis of the end of the war with Japan had been discounted as a trade factor and when it does come will have little effect.

Continued cash grain purchases by the Commodity Credit Corporation gave wheat a steady tone, although all deliveries slipped under yesterday's close. There was little pressure on the declines.

WINNIPEG, Aug. 14 (CP)—Traders in rye futures on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today displayed "peace nerves", the price trend was erratic, but in the export market the heaviest sales in months—round 9,000,000 bushels in wheat and flour—were reported.

The United Kingdom was the top buyer, taking most of the wheat, and also brought flour supplies, equivalent to 1,500,000 bushels of wheat, during the day.

There was some outside selling early in the session in rye futures, but a firmer price trend at Chicago, aided by local support, checked values here.

First Inter-Church Missionary Centenary Held At French River

As a part of the plan for holding throughout Canada during the next few months a series of Inter-Church Conferences and gatherings, in commemoration of one hundred years of overseas missionary work from the Protestant Churches of what is now Canada, a unique and interesting service was held on Sunday, August 12. It was the first of this series, and was held in the church known as "the Geddie Memorial Church," at French River, P. E. I., on the banks of the St. Lawrence River. Dr. John Geddie ministered for eight years prior to sailing for the New Hebrides, in 1846. In perfect August weather, in a scene unsurpassed for beauty, with the fields and trees of Island scenery merging into the blue of the New London Bay, and the sandy dunes of the miles of barrier to that Bay, a large gathering of peoples and hundreds of historic sites, to commemorate this notable event in the history of the Christian Church in this country.

About five hundred people filled the small building to overflowing, or sat in cars on the grass outside where, with the aid of a small amplifier, they were able to hear as well as those inside.

Overseas Mission Greetings

During the service greetings were read from the Overseas Mission Boards of the Church of England, the Baptist, the Presbyterian and the United Churches of Africa. Singing of the Doxology, and prayer by the chairman, Rev. J. A. MacGowan, minister of the Presbyterian Church in Kensington and presently Moderator of the charge including the Geddie Memorial Church, a statement of the purpose of the service was made by him.

The bell in the separate tower had previously been tolled one hundred times, one for each of the most worshipful atmosphere filled the old building, with its ancient pulpit and memorials of the past.

Fuller missionary hymns were sung, and solos were rendered by Miss Gloria Nelson and by Wm. C. Nicholson, of Blue Mountain, N.S., who are visiting the district on holiday.

The worship was in charge of Rev. T. H. Green, the rector of the New London parish of the Church of England in Canada.

Inspiring Addresses

The first address was given by Rev. E. J. Barras, of the Baptist Church in Summerside, P. E. I., representing the Baptist denomination and the "Future", telling of the going to missionary work in Burma of the recently ordained Canadian Council of Overseas Missions.

The missionary sermon was delivered by Rev. W. I. Green, who has spent many years of service as a missionary in Trinidad, E. W. I., and has of late years acted as United Church charge in Prince Edward Island.

The final address was given by Rev. J. A. MacGowan, who is presently ministering to a Presbyterian congregation in the island, but who was born in the New Hebrides, and who has the distinction of having been baptized by Rev. John Geddie, D.D., in Anneti-Yum.

Near the close of the service the tablet in memory of Dr. Geddie, which is on the wall of the day church, was read by Rev. J. O. Fraser, minister of the United Church charge including this district, and who is the first address given to his congregation by Dr. Geddie, as he left them in 1846, to go to Boston, thence to sail south to the New Hebrides. This address is given below. It hangs, framed, on the walls of his church, and having been prepared for that purpose and presented to these churches some years ago by Mrs. Albert Simpson in memory of her mother.

The large offering, after small local expenses was given to the inter-church fund for Orphaned Missions, which have been unable to receive support from their mother churches in European occupied countries for some years.

The hymn "O Spirit of the Living God", followed by the National Anthem and the benediction by Rev. J. A. MacGowan, brought this most interesting and historic meeting to a close.

This being the vacation season a number of visitors from other provinces were able to be present and their presence added greatly to the occasion.

Dr. Geddie's Farewell

Following is the text of Dr. Geddie's farewell address, Nov. 1843:

"I accept with pleasure your testimonial of respect and esteem, and from you, through our connection as minister and congregation has been of comparatively short duration it affords me no small degree of comfort to reflect that it has been distinguished by harmony, peace and love. The eight years that I have spent among you I cannot but regard as the happiest and I trust the most useful of my life. The measure of success which has attended my exertions for your spiritual good, eternally alone can reveal. Nevertheless, I have the consolation to believe that my labors have not altogether been in vain, or spent in strength for naught. In some of the greatest discouragement I have been encouraged by the hope that I have been honored by something which Christ among you indeed without this consolation I should have paused before entering

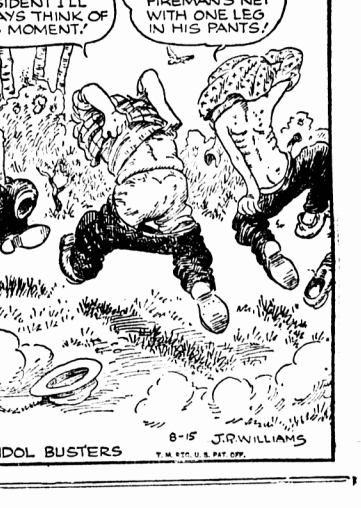
