HOT FIGHT OVER LIQUOR QUESTION. ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., May 29. -The general assembly of the Presbyterian church in session here was today torn with dissension over the efforts of Homer Castle, the recent prohibition nominee for governor in Pennsylvania, to force the convention to adopt a resolution declaring itself politically against the liquor traffic. It was declared by the excited commissioners that this was an effort to thrust the Presbyterian church into the political arena. A mid disorder lasting nearly an hour, the assembly finally passed the resolution in a modified form, eliminating the political reference. The representative board of foreign missions, was presented by Prof. S. F. Vance of Cincinnati. Sensational indictments against the men of the west and the east were made by the Rev. Arthur J. Brown, secretary of the board of foreign missions. MORE TRADE WITH ENGLAND. OTTAWA, May 29.-J. M. Munson, of the Canadian Trade Company at Leeds and Hull, England, writes to the department of trade and commerce, to say that in that part of the country there are many indications of a livelier interest in the trade relations between Canada and Great Britain. There has lately been a large increase in the number of firms sending representatives to Canada. There is also a decided increase in the number of firms asking for parliamentary information relative to the Dominion.
