CLEAN SOLDIERING,

Dr. Wada, the staff surgeon who had charge of the field hospital at Chemulpo in which many of the Russian wounded from the Variag and Korietz were treated, has made an interesting report on the incident. He found that the fragments of shell had carried into the wounds bits of clothing which caused suppuration and unless extracted promptly were an impediment to the healing process. Thereupon he wrote to the Government at Tokio recommending that it be made a rule in the navy of Japan that when battle is expected every man shall take a bath and have his clothing disinfected. It might, we would think, not always be convenient for the men on the warships to take a bath and have their clothes disinfected, but doubtless if it could be done many otherwise destined to be wounded and to die might recover from their injuries. And it must strike the reading western world with some force that Japan should thus take the lead by marking a step in advance of anything yet proposed in the way of sanitary measures before battle.

But the Japanese are great lovers of cold water, as is shown by the record of the public baths in Tokyo where it is not uncommon for from 800,000 to 1,000,000 persons to bathe daily. If cleanliness is closely akin to godliness the people of Japan cannot be wholly godless. Besides, Dr. Wada, with a touch of pardonable pride tells us: "Happily it is a rule with our men in the army as well as in the navy, always to go to battle in their newest and cleanest uniforms. This is not for any sanitary consideration, but it works the right way all the same. We Japanese used to say, as we always fight like gentlemen, we also die like gentlemen, and dressed like gentlemen." Possibly he had in mind a thought that

the Russians against whom the Japanese are fighting are not models of cleanliness or neatness. And the clean soldier, whether on the field of carnage, or in the battle of life, is never less brave for being clean, and has at least no greater risk of being killed on that account, while his chance of recovery from wounds is greatly increased by the precaution.

CANADIANS AND OTHER PEOPLE.

A movement is on foot to give the United States the name America, for brevity's sake, and to its people the name Americans. These designations are in accordance with increasing usage. They have the advantage of convenience in speaking and writing. True, the big Republic is only one of the twenty national Governments of North and South America, and its area not much more than one fifth of the soil of the two continents. But on the other hand of the 142 millions of people who live between the Arctic Ocean and Magellan Straits, all of whom are Americans in a general way, more than one half reside within the boundaries of the United States. The nation ruled from Washington is five times as populous as Brazil, six times as populous as Mexico and has about fourteen times as many people as Canada. That must count for something.

Let the people of the United States be Americans in preference to United Statesers if they will. The one word, if less definite is at least more euphonious and convenient than the two. We are also Americans, but prefer to be called by the name of our country. British, Germans, Frenchmen and Italians are Europeans, but they prefer to be known by the names of the countries they inhabit, the British Isles, Germany, France, Italy. We own the whole of Canada, and Canadian is a good, honorable well-sounding name. We hope to make it famous yet. We might, as the possessors of the northern half of North America, call ourselves North Americans par excellence. But the name Canadian suits us better. Ambitious we are, but we are also modest. We have no desire to take a name that is bigger than our broad Dominion, or to imply a possession more extensive than that covered by our flag. No one can dispute or question our title to the name Canadian. It is clear, unchallenged, unquestioned. There is something in that fact.

The London Times correspondent at Cronstadt says the Russian officials are deceiving the people with the promise to send to the east a formidable fleet of battleships and cruisers in August. He affirms that not more than one battleship of seven can be ready by August. Three others are yet far from being ready for their preliminary trials, while on two more the work of construction has but fairly begun and they cannot be ready before 1906. The remaining one, the Orel, had her back strained in an accident on the Neva, and something has gone wrong with her boilers. The correspondent implies that the cruiser section of Baltic fleet is as unready as the battleships.
