The work on the potato warehouse at Souris is being rapidly pushed. The cement floor has been completed and the secondary floor plank is now being laid. The contract calls for the completion of the building on the 15th of November, and the contractor, Mr. Bernard Creamer is apparently going to be well within the time limit.

The old warehouse on the Judge Fraser property, corner of Main and Station streets has been raised. It was last used as a garage by the Jackson Bros., now of Souris West, but the recent storm of last February rendered it unfit for occupation. This leaves a prominent corner block in the centre of our town unoccupied by any structure.

wishing the happy young couple every happiness.—S

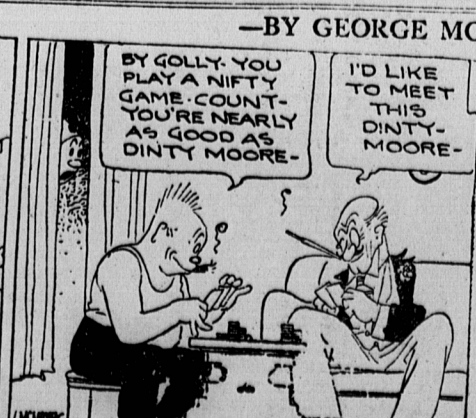
