### WRECKED OFF CAPE BRETON

NEW YORK, Jan. 2.—The American steamship Tuscarora, formerly a lake vessel and requisitioned by the United States shipping board for Atlantic service, together with her entire crew of 35 men, is believed to have been lost at sea somewhere north of Cape Breton Island, according to advices received in shipping circles today from Nova Scotia. (The Tuscarora visited this port early last month and the sailors making many friends during their stay here.)

#### POST IN COAL PRICE DECLARED CERTAIN

OTTAWA, Dec. 31.—One of the first commodities upon which the consumer will feel the increased freight rates is coal, upon which a flat advance of 15 cents per ton has been granted. Closely following a jump of 35 cents per ton at the mines early this month, the judgment of the Railway Commission adds another factor to the already unsettled coal situation, which gives no indication of improving.

At present, a mixture of different grades of coal suitable for stove and furnace use is selling at \$9.75 to \$10 per ton, and according to one local dealer the first-named figure does not cover the cost of commodity and the handling.

"We don't break even at this price," he said this morning. "An increase is certain. It can't be avoided."

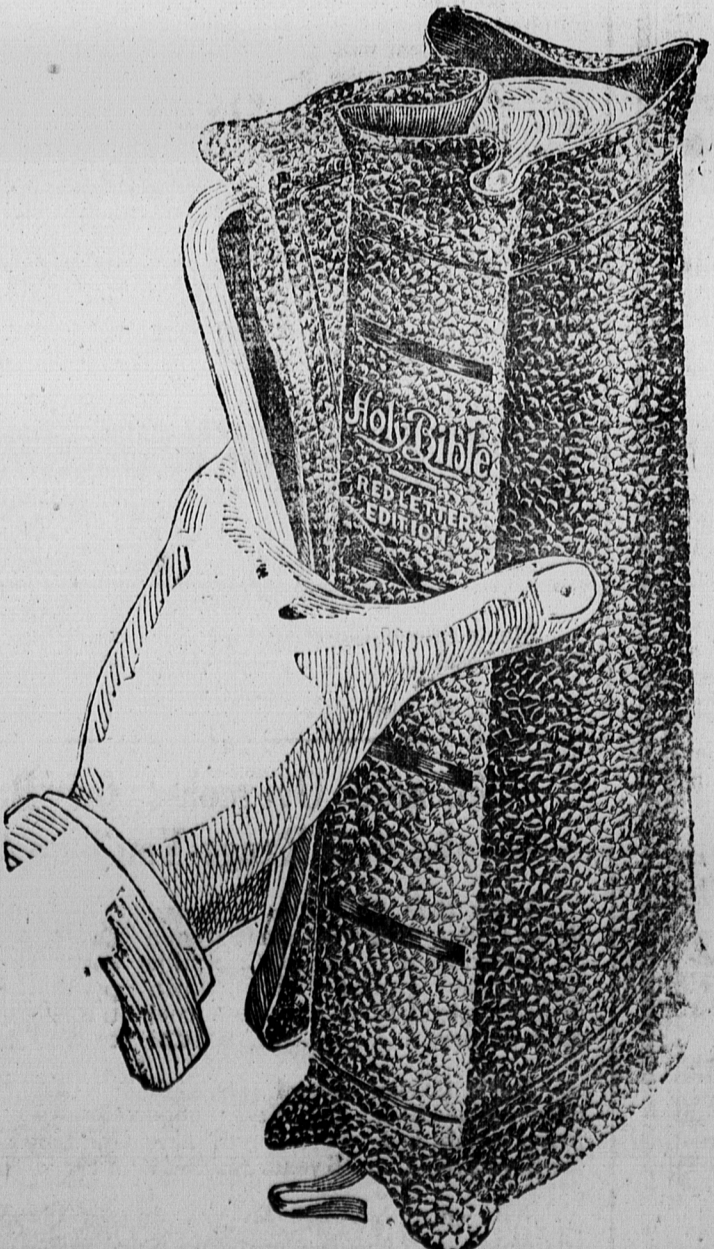

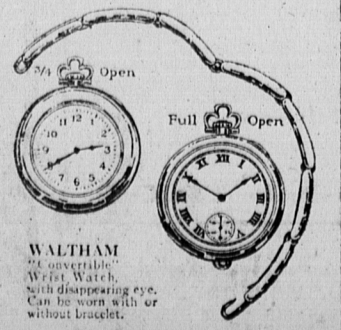
