A HALF MILLION WORSE.

OTTAWA, October 13.—The revenue for the month of September amounts to \$4,731,456 as against \$4,841,076. The expenditure for the month shows an increase of \$42,243. The revenue three months shows an increase of \$790,437. The expenditure for the quarter shows an increase of \$1,231,755, or half a million dollars worse than last year.

SUM'SIDE AND WEST

Miss JESSIE STRONG leaves to-day for a short visit to St. John.

A NUMBER of items in this column were crowded out of yesterday's edition.

THERE were 220 sheep among the shipments by the Northumberland yesterday.

OWING to the meeting being held in the town the meeting of the Board of Trade was postponed last night until tomorrow Thursday.

If the fine weather continues it is just possible that we may have a second crop of fruit this year. A little daughter of Officer Phillips Monday picked up two strawberries a short distance north of the town. One of them was ripe, while the other was quite green.

As reported in this column yesterday the marriage of Mr. J. W. Waugh and Miss Lizzie Dyer took place at Alberton yesterday morning. Though the ceremony took place before daylight the church, which was nicely decorated, was crowded. The bride was the recipient of a very large number of elegant and costly gifts.

The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held Monday night, the Mayor and all the Councillors except Councillor Waugh present. Some objection was taken to a number of the bills read, including that of the Electric Light Company, whose service, it was claimed, was not fulfilled according to contract; the bill for the building of the new east end tank which had not been inspected by the Council; and also the bill for the painting of the Market Building, which was not satisfactory to all the members of the Board. On motion the bills as read were ordered to be paid subject to the approval of the Finance Committee. The petition of Mr. John H. Boats asking for a reduction in milk license tax was again brought up and after some discussion a rebate of \$4 was allowed. The question of selling of intoxicating liquors, Sunday selling, drunkenness and other law-breaking was informally discussed, and it was explained to the police that the law and order of the town would be just what they made it; they were expected to enforce the laws and the Council as well as citizens would support them. The committees to enquire into the lighting of the town reported that no definite action was taken, and after some discussion the Council adjourned.

The ladies in charge were happy looking countenances Saturday evening evidencing a good day's trade. Many complimentary references were made by visitors, and it might be added here that though most people thought the splendidly trimmed hats were imported, this was not so, and he it said to their credit that the ladies of Messrs Sinclair & Stewart's millinery room in this grand show excelled all previous efforts and have won for themselves a reputation which will give them trade where the imported article will fail.
