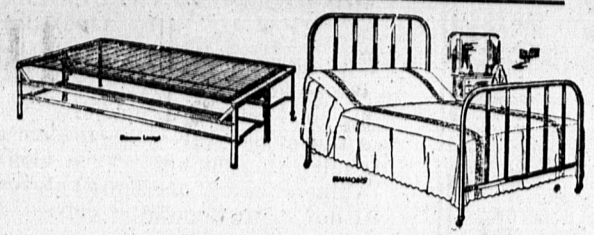

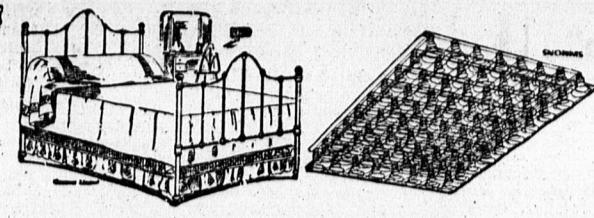

EGG LAYING CONTEST.
Notes on the P. E. Island Egg Laying Contest for the eighth week ending December 1925.
The total number of eggs for the 8th week of the P. E. Island Egg Laying Contest was 328 eggs, an increase of 36 eggs over the production for last week.
The total eggs to date is 2364 or 653 eggs ahead of the total at the same date last year.
The total number of points awarded to date is 18233.
The Experimental Station White Leghorns pen No. 1 leads in production for the week with 49 eggs. Everett Howatt's White Leghorns were second with 38 eggs. The Experimental Station White Leghorns pen No. 3, were third with 37 eggs. Mr. Talmage Foster's pen of Barred Rocks were fourth with 36 eggs and Mrs. Fred McInniere's White Leghorns and Charles MacKenna's Barred Rocks tied for fifth place with 35 eggs each.
Mr. Talmage Foster's pen of Barred Rocks still leads the Contest with 206.5 points. Mr. Everett Howatt's White Leghorns are second with 155.5 points. The Experimental Station White Leghorns pen No. 1 are third with 143.2 followed by their White Leghorns No. 4, with 143.3 points.
Twenty-six eggs were laid during the week which were disallowed on account of small size.
