**MAKE IT EASIER FOR OPERATIONS**

**BOSTON, Dec. 8-(CP)**—The child who swallowed a penny, or his parent, who just has a plain sore throat, will now find their physician better equipped to cope with the emergency. New surgical instruments which carry light around curves, permitting illumination of any affected inner part of the body, were introduced recently to the Anglican College of Surgeons.

The new tools of medicine are made of a plastic material called "Lucite" methyl methacrylate, the tongue-twisting designation arising from its chemical constituents. Clear as glass, it has the peculiar property of transmitting light throughout the entire length of a rod, so that the electric bulb supplying it can be in the handle of the instrument, rather than actually at its end.
