## DOG SAVED LIFE OF HIS MASTER

### Big Dog Belonging to One-armed Night Watchman Aided His Owner to Fight Thugs and Then Brought Detective to Scene.

NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—A big St. Bernard dog that for several years has been the companion of seventy-one year old Edward Cura, a one-armed man, of 481 Fifty-eight street, Brooklyn, yesterday saved its master from bleeding to death. Cura is a watchman at uncompleted buildings at Seventy-second street and Sixteen avenue. Just before dawn two men attacked him. The old man fought fiercely with his one hand and called to his dog.

In a few seconds the dog had bitten one man so severely that he fell to the ground. The animal attacked the other, but not before old Edward had been struck from behind and his skull split. The two men, despite the dog's furious attacks, robbed the old man of \$10 and ran. Following them was the dog. The men separated and the dog lost the trail.

The dog then nosed up to Detective De Gantillon, barking and fawning upon him. Finally the great St. Bernard led the

detective in front of the houses at Seventy-second street and howled. The detective saw the old man Cura lying unconscious on the sidewalk, and the injured man was taken to the Norwegian hospital. Had assistance come ten minutes later Cura would have died. Friends are caring for the "grand old dog," as they call him, but yesterday he wrenched at his chain and whined for his master.

## BIG LINER SWEEP BY GREAT SEAS

SOUTHAMPTON, Oct. 8.—The American line steamer St. Paul, which left New York September 28, steamed into this port today, 24 hours late. Her voyage is described as having been most thrilling. She entered severe gales and mountainous seas pounded her hull with great force and broke over her deck.

Having gone through this peril the steamer ran into a dense fog and Chief Officer Osborn, who commanded her owing to the indisposition of Captain Passow, had to grope his way to Plymouth by means of the lead.

From the time the St. Paul left New York Chief Officer Osborn saw neither ships nor other points of observation. When the fog finally lifted the ship was in Plymouth Sound. The White Star Company have intimated to the Southampton harbor authorities that an increased depth of water will be required for vessels larger than the Adriatic.

## MINUTES OF PRESBYTERY

At Halifax and within St. Matthew's Presbyterian Church here, on Wednesday the 2nd day of October 1907, and at 12:30 o'clock p. m., the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met, pursuant to adjournment at the call of the Moderator of Synod, and was constituted by the moderator pro tempore, Mr. Geo. E. Ross, with whom were present Messrs N. M. McLeod, John Hawley, A. D. Stirling, R. G. Strathie, G. C. Robertson, T. F. Fullerton, A. B. McLeod, A. Gray, H. Michael, A. Craise, Ministers, H. McMillan, T. C. James, Stewart Hunter, George Bell, A. S. Nicholson and Dr. John Jardine, elders.

Mr. T. F. Fullerton reported that the Augmentation Fund Committee had granted the sum of \$50 in behalf of the congregation of Murray Harbor South. On motion the name of Mr. George Bell was substituted for that of Mr. Angus McPhee as representative elder of the session of Murray Harbor South.

Mr. H. Michael tendered his resignation as ordinary Missionary at Orwell. After hearing Mr. A. S. Nicholson, commissioner of the session and congregation of Orwell it was decided on motion that the resignation be accepted to take effect on and after the 6th day of October instant. Mr. S. D. McPhee Belfast was appointed interim moderator of the session at Orwell. Mr. T. F. Fullerton was empowered to apply to the Home Mission Fund Committee for a grant of \$210 to pay for pulpit supply at Tryon, Hampton and Bonshaw. Presbytery then adjourned to meet in quarterly session, on Tuesday, the 5th day of November next, at 10 o'clock a. m., of which public intimation was given, and this solemn act was closed with the benediction.

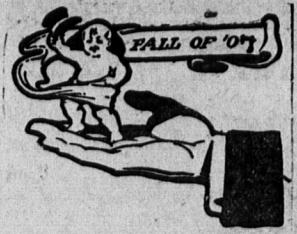

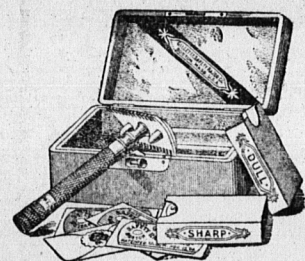
