JOURNALISTIC INDEPENDENCE AND RECIPROCITY.

Our policy, however imperfectly it may be carried out, is to be frank and candid with both the Government and with the people.

A newspaper may outlast many Governments, if it deserves well at the hand of its readers and patrons.

TENDERS FOR BRANCH RAILWAYS.

Elsewhere in this issue appears the advertisement of the Department of Railways and Canals calling for tenders for the construction of a branch railway from O'Leary to West Point, and of a section of the projected New London Railway, the section extending 3 1/2 miles from Clifton Bridge to Stanley Bridge.

What The Liberals Have Done For Prince Edward Island
