Conclusion of Debate on the City of Charlottetown Bill—Clause Eight is Passed—Amendment to the Prohibition Act—The Estimates Taken up.

Thursday, April 19, 1906. MORNING SESSION. House went into committee on motion of Mr. Mathieson to consider the absent Debtor's Act, 1879.

SAN FRANCISCO IN ROARING FLAMES BY SATURDAY WILL BE AN ASH HEAP

All Efforts to Check the Fire are Powerless, the People Flying in Thousands, Hungry, Thirsty, Penniless, Water Twenty-five Cents a Glass, 300,000 Homeless—Contributions Pouring In, U. S. Government Gives a Million—Los Angeles Shaken Yesterday, Santa Rosa Totally Wrecked and Thousands Killed.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 19—(Special)—At midnight the fire is still raging with unabated vehemence and the whole city is apparently doomed. All the business and the most thickly settled residential districts are already destroyed or burning.

NEW YORK, April 19—(Special)—The following telegram was received at 10.30 tonight from the Deputy Chief of the San Francisco Fire Department: The fire is still under headway, gathering force and spreading. Two-thirds of the business section is devastated.

SAN FRANCISCO LARGEST CITY

In California—A Population of About 360,000, and a Great Seaport.

NEW YORK, April 18.—San Francisco is the largest city in California and the largest on the Western coast of America or in the United States, west of the Mississippi River, ninth in rank as to population in the United States, and seventh seaport in commercial importance.

San Francisco has 17 square miles of territory or about 30,000 acres within the municipal limits. Many of the streets, especially in the northern and western part of the city, are very steep, and the hills are mounted by cable cars.

THE GATES OF PEKIN CITY. LONDON, April 18—To this day the great gates in the walls of Peking are closed every evening with the queer ceremonies that have been observed for centuries past.
