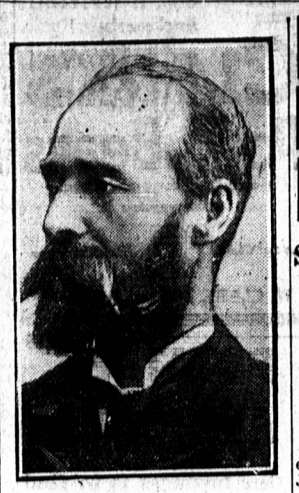

DESPERADOES ASQUITH GIVEN LABOR BANK HEMMED IN BY GREAT OVALION POLICE ARMY AT GREENOCK AFTER ROBBERY

Sawed Off Shot Guns and Machine Guns Face Citizenry--Two Bandits May Attempt to Shoot Their Way to Safety.

NEWARK, N. J., Oct. 16. - Governor A. Harry Moore of New Jersey has offered to mobilize the militia and every resource of the state in pursuit of the Elizabeth mail bandits who Thursday killed a postal employee, wounded three others and escaped with \$180,000 cash.

In a thirty mile circle about the Watchung Mountains is encamped an army of five hundred state and city police reinforced by armed citizenry. Somewhere in the circle it is believed are the bandits armed with sawed off shotguns and machine guns which fire four hundred shots a minute.
