Selected Stocks Show Recovery On N.Y. Market

NEW YORK, Dec. 3—(AP)—Selected stocks got a belated foothold on recovery in today's market after the list had been depressed most of the session by further pessimism over the coal crisis. Losses ran to 2 or more points for pivots in the forenoon with selling light. Buyers began to step in after midday and extreme declines were trimmed or converted into advances in the final hour. Canadian issues were mixed with liquids improved and mines easy. Distillers Seagram gained 3-8 and Hiram Walker 1-8. Canadian Pacific rose 1-4. Down 1-4 were Dome Mines and McIntyre. Lake Shore, on the curb, dropped 1-2. East-end extra disbursements lifted Montgomery Ward 1 3-8 at 59 3-8, and Marshall Field 1 at 33 1-4. Eastman Kodak added 2 1-2 at 220. Du Pont 2 at 177 1-2 and Chrysler 1 1-4 at 84. Improved were Behlenger, General Motors, Sears Roebuck, Reading International Harvester, American Telephone, Consolidated Edison, Southern Pacific, Southern Railway, Chesapeake and Ohio, Texas Co., Phelps Dodge, Public Service of N. J. and Johns-Manville. Fractional recessors were shown for Goodrich, J. I. Case, United Aircraft, North American, Santa Fe, Standard Oil (NJ), Westinghouse, General Electric and American Can.

Trading Dull On Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Dec. 3—(CP)—Securities followed Wall Street trends closely today in dull transactions on the stock exchange and curb market. Prices were marked down on balance up to the fifth hour when a limited rally set in. At the bell, papers, utilities and banks were higher in the indices and industrials lower. Golds touched a new low for 1946. A few bright spots all day. Shawinigan reacted with a rise to announcement of the company's expansion program while Southern Canada Power was firmer after publication of its annual report showing improved earnings. Provincial Transport added to recent advances. In papers, stronger were St. Lawrence Paper, Pressed, St. Lawrence Common, Powell, Eddy and Abitibi deferred. Consolidated Abitibi Common, rived from loss to win territory. Down were B. C. Pulp, Fraser, Dryden, International, M. and O. Brown, H. Smith and Pulp. Donnacosa wiped out a slip. In industrials were D. Coal Preferred, Gypsum and Oilcloth. Easter were Ford, which opened firmer. Steleo, Massey, Asbestos, M. Locomotive, Showwin, R. Mitchell, C. Locomotive, D. Glass and Tar. N. S. Car recovered from a stumble. Lang lost a lift. Celanese backed up in textiles. In beverages, Alco "A" and "B", Seagrams and Walker improved and C. and N. Breweries eased. Brazilian converted a decrease into a gain in utilities and Bell and B. Power "A" were also ahead. Royal moved from the losers' to the winners' column in banks and others better were Nova Scotia, Imperial and Nationale. Commerce and Motors receded. In carriers, C.P.R. and Steamship Preferred tumbled and Steamship Common was off for a time. Smelters and Noranda weakened in metals. In oil refiners, McCol, and C.
