Contractors Have Failed to Get the Roosevelt in Shape in Time to Leave—Trip Will be Postponed For a Year.

New York, Aug. 11.—Commander Peary's dash for the pole has been postponed. Failure to complete the repairs on his ship the Roosevelt, has compelled the explorer to put off his trip until next year. to their agreement, the main expedition of the Peary Arctic Club will be postponed for a year and the Roosevelt, when the work of repairs is completed, will go on a flying trip to deposit my proposed coal depot at Etah, Greenland, returning the last of September.

"In this connection it is proper to state the contract for the construction and installation of the two new boilers for the Roosevelt was made upon the assurance of the contractors that the work should be completed on June 1, and this provision was embodied in the contract.

"As a matter of fact the boilers are only just completed and the installation has yet to be begun. This will require several days and put the departure of the main expedition so late in the season as to be inadvisable.

"The question of funds does not and has not entered in this unfortunate situation. The contract for the work was guaranteed and all payments have been met when due."

MOTOR SPEEDING CRAZE AGAIN

New York, Aug. 11.—A serious accident occurred at the Brighton Beach race track at 2:30 this morning, during the International endurance Derby for automobiles, a contest which started at 10 o'clock last night and which is to continue for 24 hours. The Pillian car, driven by Strong, threw a tire at the run into the stretch, ran into a fence and knocked down many persons, seven of whom were injured. Four persons sustained broken arms and legs, while the others were cut and bruised. The injured were taken to the hospital at Coney Island.

OLD MANUSCRIPTS FOUND IN EGYPT

LONDON, Eng. Aug. 11.—Parchment and papyrus manuscripts of the greatest interest have recently been discovered at Edfu, in Upper Egypt, near the site of an old Coptic monastery, and have now been brought to this country and are under examination. There are about a dozen rolls of Greek papyrus of the sixth century, and a number of Coptic and Greek ecclesiastical manuscripts of the ninth to the eleventh centuries. Parts of the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke in Greek and Coptic, the Apocalypse in Coptic, a sermon of the Sacred Cross by Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem (A. D. 351—386), and a unique MS. in the Nubian language, dealing with the life of St. Menas and the canons of the Council of Nicea, are included in the find.

Synops's of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, containing 80 and 160 acres reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, acres, more or less. Entry must be made personally at the local office for the district in which the land is situated. The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon "ranging land" owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. Six months' notice in writing should be given the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent. Deputy of the Interior. N.
