ATTEMPT TO OVERTHROW MEXICAN GOVT.

Revolutionary Movement Widespread and Rumor Says Rebels About to Attack.

SAN DIEGO, Aug. 21.—Papers seized when General Enrique Estrada, former Mexican secretary of war with a band of his followers, were arrested at Dulzura, imperial valley, Sunday night, have revealed an extensive attempt to overthrow the Mexican government, Captain A. A. Hopkins, of the department of Justice believes. Captain Hopkins said last night that although a complete study of the documents has not been made, it has been learned that the revolutionary movement assumed wide proportions, incidentally with his remarks will be read tomorrow. City of Kalgan Evacuated

PEKING, August 21.—The city of Kalgan has been completely evacuated by the Kuomintang (nationalist) army which has continued its retreat from Nankow toward Fengchen, roughly 100 miles westward, following its recent defeat at the hands of allied forces of Marshalls Wu Pei Fu and Chang Tso Ling.
