The regular monthly meeting of the School Board was held last evening at 8 p. m. The teacher's reports showed the enrollment for the past month to be 1323; the average attendance 1104; the percentage of attendance 87; number of cases of tardiness 234; truancy 6; visits to parents 182; notices 121; corporal punishment 10; below average in grading 9; requests to leave school before the hour for dismissal 145; the average temperature of the school room, 65. The following teachers reported that they had no cases of tardiness for the month. Miss Harris, Miss Scott, Mr. Bowness, Mr. Young. The highest percentage of attendance in Prince Street School was made in Miss Hooper's department 93% in Queen Square School, Mr. Lundrigan 91, in West Kent, Mr. Owen's 92. Plans and specifications for repairs and alterations to janitor's cottage West Kent School, also plans and specification for fitting up two new class rooms in the Assembly Hall in West Kent Street School were submitted and ordered to lie on the table till the special meeting would be called for the purpose. After passing some bills the meeting adjourned.

**BRITISH AND AMERICAN WATER TRANSPORT.**

The average British cargo steamer carries 2,000 tons. The American lake steamers carry 6,000 tons. The English steamer therefore has to make three trips from Bilbao to Britain to deliver as much as the lake steamer carries in one trip to port of delivery. The distance in both cases is practically the same, that from Bilbao being 1,100 miles, and that on the lakes 800 to 1,000 miles.

The average freight from Bilbao over a period would be about 4s. 61. per ton, a minimum being 3s. 9d. and a maximum 7s. 6d. The average time for all round voyage may be taken as two weeks, viz: Outward voyage three days, waiting turn for tip at Bilbao and time taking cargo four days, homeward voyage three days, waiting turn for berth and time discharging four days, total fourteen days. First 2,000-ton cargo, two weeks; second, 2,000-ton cargo, two weeks; third 2,000-ton cargo, two weeks—making six weeks for the 6,000 tons which the Lake steamer delivers in one week—the Lake steamer's time being outward passage two days loading one day returning two days and discharging two days—in all seven days.

The extra freight cost to Britain is then at least 2s. 6d. per ton over lake freights. It takes two tons of ore to make one ton of steel; this means a permanent extra cost of 5s. per ton of steel for freight transit alone. E. Phillips in The Engineering Magazine for May.
