SCHOOL PICNIC ENDS IN DEATH!

Over 1,000, Mostly Women and Children Burned to Death or Drowned on the Excursion Str. on the East River New York.

NEW YORK, June 15.—One of the most appalling disasters in the history of New York was the catastrophe that took place yesterday in the East River, within sight of thousands of people, the majority of whom were powerless to render assistance. By the burning of the General Slocum, a three decked excursion steamer, the largest in these waters, over one thousand people, the majority of whom were children, were burned to death or drowned by jumping overboard or being thrown into the water by the lurching of the vessel.

Approximately 500 bodies have been recovered and are being tagged at the morgues of Bellevue hospital and Harlem. Divers are still busy taking bodies from the vessel's hold, which they say is choked with bodies, and those who fell or were thrown into the river have not been recovered.

It was the annual excursion of the Sunday school of St. Mark's German Lutheran church, the congregation of which is drawn from the dense population of the lower east and west sides. It is variously estimated that 1,200 to 2,500 persons were on the steamer. The scene on the decks as she proceeded up the East River was one of harmless merriment.

The fire is said to have broken out in the lunch room on the forward deck, through the overheating of a pot. The wind was high and all efforts to subdue the fire were fruitless. At 1:30 there were several lumber yards and oil tanks, and Capt. Wm. Von Schack, in command of the Slocum, started to turn his vessel towards the shore. He was warned that it would fire the lumber and oil, so he was forced to proceed half a mile further on, where the boat was beached. Meanwhile the passengers became panic stricken. Those who were not caught by the flames rushed to the stern of the vessel, where hundreds jumped into the swiftly running water. It is alleged that life preservers were too securely fastened to be available and stories are told of frantic efforts to cut them loose, but even if they could have been torn down, they were too high for the children to reach. It is also alleged that no attempt was made to get out the fire apparatus at the first cry of fire.

According to several statements, no attempt was made to lower the boats or life rafts. The race to North Brothers Island was horrible dramatic. It was while the flames which had been fanned into a fury by the strong heat and wind was consuming hundreds of the old and young. The scene was one of frightful panic, with men, women and children jumping overboard and being dashed by the whirlpools of the channel against the vessel's side. Many women and children were crowded together on the hurricane deck, which soon burned away and fell. It is believed most of these on the deck were burned.

The after rail next gave way and the passengers who had crowded against it were pushed and children became separated and frantically sought each other, while in several cases mothers together jumped with their children into the water. Little children holding each other by the hand jumped together and were afterwards found clasped in each others arms. It is alleged that men fought with women to escape and in so doing trampled under foot scores of children. During her run to North Brothers Island, the Slocum's whistle kept blowing for assistance but before the whistle began to blow several times started after the vessel.

The number of these craft constantly grew and not the least dramatic incidents of the catastrophe were the efforts of those boats to rescue those who had jumped into the water. Men crowded to the rails of the tugs and caught up drowning persons as they were borne by the current. There were many thrilling rescues by these means. North Brothers Island, where the vessel was beached, contains a scarlet fever ward and the patients who witnessed the disaster were ordered indoors and doctors hastened to the rescue of those who had been washed ashore, but scores died while they were being attended to. Capt. Von Schack and two pilots have been arrested.

The scene on North Brothers Island was a pitiful one, as body after body was washed ashore or brought in in boats and added to the long row on the beach. As the bodies of the living and dead were taken from the water the living were taken to the hospitals on the beach. Hysterical women and frantic men wandered along the long row of corpses searching for children and friends; women with disfigured faces, their clothes partially torn from them, were carried to the improvised emergency hospitals crying for the children who had been carried from them in that mad rush when the boat took fire.

Meanwhile the Slocum burned to the water's edge. It is estimated nearly 100 charred bodies were on her decks. Name tags picked up 88 charred corpses. Name tags of these, it is thought, can be identified. Heads, legs and arms are burned and not a shred of clothing is left on any of them. Forty-four bodies have already been recovered. The scene at the morgue was harrowing in the extreme. Inside the pier the bodies were arranged

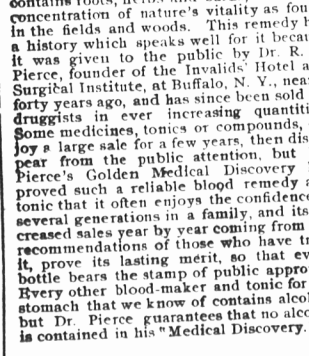
