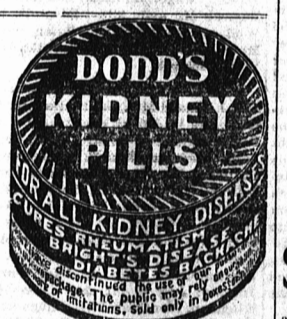
### ACCIDENT TO ST. JOHN TRAVELER
