### Religion And Life

When Dan Crawford, the famous missionary to Africa, visited the Canadian West years ago he gave an address to the students of Westminster Hall, Vancouver. In the course of his remarks he said: "When I left for Africa we were in the age of steam; while I was in Africa, you passed through the age of electricity; on my return I find you in the age of the explosion." It is by the explosion that our automobiles are driven; every year sees extensions of the use of the internal combustion engine; man's mastery of the principle of driving his wheels by explosion has opened a new era of energy in the world. He wonders how wrought reaching even to the conquest of the air.

When we were in Alberta a few days ago we visited the Leduc oil field. As we drove along we noticed a column of black smoke rising, which we turned toward. It was just a half hour before we reached the spot, oil had been struck at a depth of 5180 feet and they were burning off the first flow. And there, from the depths of the earth, there was pouring forth a stream of pure energy available for the uses of men. It dazzled our imagination to realize that far beneath the surface of the earth lay these vast streams of latent power extending away to the Arctic, and that man can control and direct these towards his own ends.

Most wonderful of all, every publication that we open contains stories of power brought out of the rock, that mysterious atomic energy which is opening up strange possibilities for civilization.

When Rutherford discovered the energy in the atom, the editor of the *Clarion*, a noted unbeliever, stated that if the basis of the universe should prove to be energy rather than inert matter, he might have to change the whole direction of his thinking, and conclude that the ultimate reality was mind. Long before science opened up these sources of power and mastered them, religion taught that power was to be found in God, and that men might be linked with the Creator Spirit by whom all things were made. Said Jesus to His Followers after His resurrection: "Ye shall receive power after that the Holy Spirit is come upon you." Consider the men to whom these words were spoken. According to the standards of their time they were "unlearned and ignorant men." But they had been three years with Jesus, under the influence of His personality, watching His works and working with Him in His ministries of grace, subject to His discipline and listening to His teachings. These were the men for the fire and when the divine flame flashed into their souls at Pentecost, it kindled a fire within them that warmed and brightened the world. They became men of might; through their testimony men by the thousand were changed in nature and linked with God. The Church was brought into being and started on her course of world-conquest, and Christ was crowned and

For the last few hours he was in an agonizing and rapidly growing weaker.

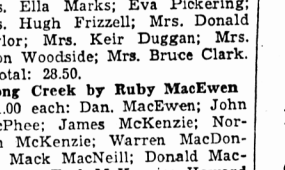

### OUR DESTRUCTIVE HAWK

Very unfortunately Hawks in general have a bad reputation, yet the majority are quite innocent — even beneficial. The member of the family chiefly responsible for this is the handsome but destructive Goshawk, larger than the heading "Accipiters", all of which are rapacious. Because of greater size, it does by far the most damage. We may be thankful that this fearless, savage bird is not to be found in settled Canada except from late fall until early spring. Only when food becomes scarce in the breeding grounds that reach across the northern part of the continent does this hardy Hawk move south.

To the majority of us any Hawk is simply "a Hawk". As one is seldom seen at rest, and close by, it is important to learn how to recognize each kind by its silhouette and manner of flight when passing overhead. Accipiters' tails are long and narrow, their wings short and rounded; they progress by alternately flapping and sailing, with a minimum amount of soaring.

The savageness of a mother Goshawk is realized only too well by anyone foolish enough to climb near her nest. Her terrible talons can pierce right through a leather coat. The home is usually in a conifer well inside dense woods, and placed about 35 feet from the ground. Nestlings are fed rabbits, squirrels, and birds. The Goshawk is powerful enough to carry off a Ptarmigan or even a 17 inch Ruffed Grouse, and likes nothing better than poultry.

When they leave home young Goshawks are brown on top, lighter underneath, the white breasts heavily streaked in brown. Adults are pale blue-grey, with white undersides having fine, dark streaks. Dark tail bands, a white stripe over the eye, and yellow legs and feet are common to all ages.

Female Hawks are always larger than males. In the case of Goshawks, the average lengths are 24 and 22 inches respectively. A large, young, female Cooper's Hawk (another Accipiter) might easily be mistaken for a small, young, male Goshawk, because their colouring is almost identical, the difference between the rounded end of one tail and the straight end of the other is not noticeable, and it is possible for them to be the very same size. This mistaken identity is harmless. But when a useful, young male Red-tail instead of the real culprit is killed by a poultry

### 100 Million To Develop Oil In Western Canada

More than \$100,000,000 is being put into the development of western oil this year. Next year the figure may reach \$150,000,000.

That represents the faith of oil companies and investors that a great new resource has been found which will pay off. They regard it as an opportunity.

Unfortunately, opportunities also bring opportunists; some characters who wish to turn a fast dollar; preferably your dollar, or anybody else's dollar, and turn it into their own pockets.

They present a problem to governments; to the legitimate brokerage business; and, of course, to the public.

Ontario has been accused outside its borders for not clamping down strongly enough on high-pressure promoters.

The Toronto Stock Exchange this week heard from a Western oil man who thinks that the Ontario Security Commission should do more than it is doing.

He is C. O. Nickle, of Calgary, publisher of the Daily Oil Bulletin, and in an address to exchange members he said in part:

"In the last years there has been a very marked upswing in public interest, investment and speculation in the Western oil and gas industry. There has been a substantial increase in participation by the more conservative investment and brokerage houses, chartered banks and insurance companies, and private and industrial capital. There also has been a marked increase in publicly-owned risk capital for exploration. Responsible Toronto investment dealers share in the credit for these accomplishments....

"Unfortunately also... the Western oil boom has given rise, particularly in Toronto, to speculative stock issues and methods of financing which critically lengthen the odds against investor profit....

"I recall one letter received recently from an old lady in Nova Scotia. A persuasive Toronto stock peddler, via long-distance telephone, had sold her shares at 20 cents a share. The paper said Gen. Tulovsky died after a short but serious illness.

### Gasoline Prices In Nova Scotia To Decline Half-Cent

HALIFAX, Nov. 25 — (CP) — Price of gasoline for Nova Scotia motorists will be a half-cent lower per gallon effective Thursday, Dec. 1, J. A. Hanway, chairman of the Public Utilities Board, announced tonight.

The price cut ordered by the Board will apply to both regular and premium grades and to all parts of the province. Wholesale price in Halifax after Dec. 1 will be 20 cents a gallon for regular grade. Retail price will be 38 cents for regular and 40 for premium. Elsewhere in Nova Scotia the prices will be 39 1/2 and 41 1/2.

Mr. Hanway said in a statement that the drop in price here is a consequence of a half-cent reduction in the cargo price of gasoline on the Gulf Coast of the United States. The Gulf Coast price is a basis of the Board's formula for regulating prices in Nova Scotia.
