NEW PATENT LAW. The bill presented by the Honorable Sydney Fisher, Minister of Agriculture, and which received its first reading May 28th, 1903, became law on August 13th last. The new law makes the term of Canadian Patents heretofore granted, or to be granted, entirely independent of corresponding foreign patents (Sections 2 and 16); it allows the placing of patents under The Compulsory License System in lieu of the actual manufacture of the patented article (Sections 7 and 10); and it permits the revival of certain patents which were not worked or manufactured as required by the old law. The condition of Canadian inventors is much improved by the new law, and it is expected that the number of patents applied for will greatly increase in the near future.
