THE LATEST PLAN FOR THE NORTH POLE

BROOKLYN Feb. 2.—The philosopher who remarked that there is no new thing under the sun probably did not have the north pole in mind when he uttered this now venerable fallacy. Never, perhaps, since the earth was discovered to be round have there been so many wild and fanciful schemes for attaining its geographical pole, apparently possessing an exhaustless fascination for talkers, dreamers and theorists.

One of the latest, provisionally endorsed, too, by so high an Arctic authority as ex-President Sir Clements Markham of the Royal Geographical Society is that of the Englishman Harrison, author of the just out Search for a Polar Continent, an entertaining and discursive tale of two years in sub-Arctic Alaska and Canada, though all that is told about the search is in less than half a page.

Mr. Harrison, who has yet to make his record on sea ice, proposes to sledge from Prince Patrick's Land 1,500 miles, to Spitzbergen, with ever 150 dogs, 11 Eskimos and ten tons of freight, provision for nine months, each sledge starting with 1,200 pounds. As if this on its face, was not impossible to any one who has never attempted the polar back, with no base on which to retreat in case of disaster, Mr. Harrison though his schedule requires 260 days, almost nine months, proposes to start in October and make the greater part of the journey in the winter night.

Should darkness and storms not prove sufficient obstacles, men will be at their lowest physically and mentally, the only redeeming fact being the possibility that the ice may be less open and broken than later in the season. What Mr. Harrison proposes to do if he ever gets to Spitzbergen, whether to await the summer steamers, to come home on a casual balloon or to return over his own track, is not disclosed, nor is it particularly necessary, since the chances of his getting to Spitzbergen are less than those of any sensible citizen of Brooklyn who stays at home.

Evelyn B. Baldwin, who has had Arctic experience, and been photographed in several dramatic circumstances, offers a project which combines mobility and uncertainty to an exceptional degree. So far as the newspapers disclose, Mr. Baldwin proposed to establish a logging factory or lumber yard, of indefinite dimensions, on some extensive and handy floe, upon which he can discharge his plant, north of Behring straits, and then let her drift, with the faith and the hope that the currents will take the outfit over the pole.

The Harrison-Baldwin schemes, indeed, suggest that they might be improved and strengthened by combination. By the time Mr. Baldwin's floating log settlement should meet Mr. Harrison's dogs and Eskimos, if they had not eaten all their stock of rice, oatmeal and cod liver oil, for these are all that is to be allowed for food, they will certainly have had enough of them and be quite willing to share Mr. Baldwin's society and supplies.

In addition to these picturesque and spectacular projects, the rumor that Mr. Wellman is to venture again next summer with a balloon, will not down, and experience makes reasonably certain a sufficient supply of "copy" whether Mr. Wellman cuts loose or not, while as a more serious airship proposition, the mind of Count Zeppelin is mentioned as working toward the pole.

Fortunately, however, for those who take the pole seriously, Capt. Roald Amundsen, of northwest passage fame, is far advanced with his plans to put the Fram into the ice north of Behring straits, a year from next spring, and those in reasonably close touch with polar work are not likely either to forget that the American, Peary, whose 87 degrees, six minutes north, holds the world's record, is due at the pole at 12 o'clock, noon, on Thursday, April 15, 1909, and the sun, which will light him thither, is rising higher every day.

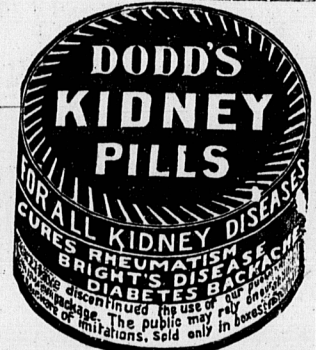

FISHERIES QUESTION STILL IN DISPUTE

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Feb. 2.—The Colonial Government has not given its assent as yet to the proposed fishery agreement between Great Britain and the United States and the opinion is expressed in some quarters that it will fall. Premier Bond and his Cabinet decline to discuss the situation for publication, but it is admitted in Government circles that a dead-lock exists.

The Opposition press holds the view point that Premier Bond is unwilling to allow claims of American vessel owners for damages caused by the detention of schooners to be submitted to The Hague for arbitration.
