MAKES LIQUOR SELLING A CRIME.

The decision in the prohibition case, *Jenkins versus Murray*, by Stipendiary Magistrate Macdonald, that a wife is not a competent or compellable witness in a prosecution against her husband in prohibition cases, no doubt accords with the popular conception of the fitness of things. The relations between husband and wife are such that there are obvious reasons why in criminal cases the wife might be supposed from fear or favor to swerve from the truth in giving her testimony.

On the other hand the Prohibitory Law in none of its sections explicitly declares the illegal sale of liquor to be criminal or to be a crime in the legal sense of that word. And the British North America Act gives exclusive power to the Parliament of Canada to deal with "the criminal law, except the constitution of the courts of criminal jurisdiction, but including the procedure in criminal matters". That must mean that the Provincial Legislature has no power to enact a criminal law. It can create a court with criminal jurisdiction, but the enactment of all criminal laws and the procedure in criminal cases are matters belonging wholly to the Parliament of Canada.

The Prohibitory Law makes the sale of liquors unlawful, declares it to be "an

offence" and prescribes penalties for the violation of the law. This is another and a different thing from declaring the unlawful sale of liquor to be a crime. In the moral sense of the word and in view of the evils which result from liquor selling many persons will hold the liquor seller guilty as a criminal, but we are now dealing with the purely legal aspects of the case. The Legislature has not power to declare liquor selling a crime and has not done so.

It is because of these conditions that grave doubts arise as to the validity of the Magistrate's decision. In effect that decision makes liquor selling a crime in the eye of the law. Many persons will sympathise with this view and hold that if it is not a crime it ought to be so declared, but that is beside the question at issue. The vital question is whether the "offence" of violating the Prohibitory Law is of such a nature as to render a wife incompetent or not compellable as a witness in a prosecution for violation of that law.

But if the wife of the person charged is both incompetent and not compellable as a witness in such cases it would seem to follow that the person charged with the offence is equally incompetent. And this is a point much more vital than that in regard to the wife. As the practice has been a person charged with violation of the Prohibitory Law has sometimes taken the witness stand and explained or rebutted the evidence against him so as to escape conviction where a prima facie case had been made out against him. Persons

charged with illegal liquor selling would not relish being shut out from giving testimony, but may yet find that the point raised by zealous counsel in their behalf and the Magistrate's decision thereon will be more sweeping in their effects than had been anticipated.

As Prince has gone so the Province will go in voting out the Scott Act and bringing in Prohibition. "Forward" is the word all along the line.

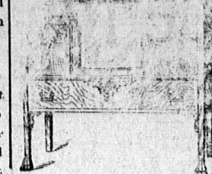
Our condolences to the *Summerside Journal*. The people of the Western Capital seem not wholly to share the *Journal's* red hot admiration for the Scott Act.
