R. C. A. F. Call For Help

Immediate enlistment is offered by the R. C. A. F. to qualified men as direct entry Aero Engine and Airframe Mechanics. Applicants found acceptable in this trade do not have to go to a Trade School for the necessary training but will commence their duties immediately. Mechanics and others who thoroughly understand the care and maintenance of motors, engines, pumps and other mechanical parts and who have had aircraft experience are desired for this branch of the Service. Such applicants must have a high technical skill and be successful in passing the tests along these lines. There are also openings for maintenance of motors, engines, pumps and other mechanical parts in this category get an intensive training in drill, rifle training, and handling of various firearms such as Machine Guns and Automatics. This naturally is an important branch of the Service and applicants must be of a sound character as well as body. BOB HOPE SCORES AGAIN IN FAST FILM

Bob Hope, king of the comics, needs every gag he's got to get him out of the tight spots in the fast-paced Paramount film, "My Favorite Blonde," the riotous spy chase opera that opens tonight at the Prince Edward Theatre. 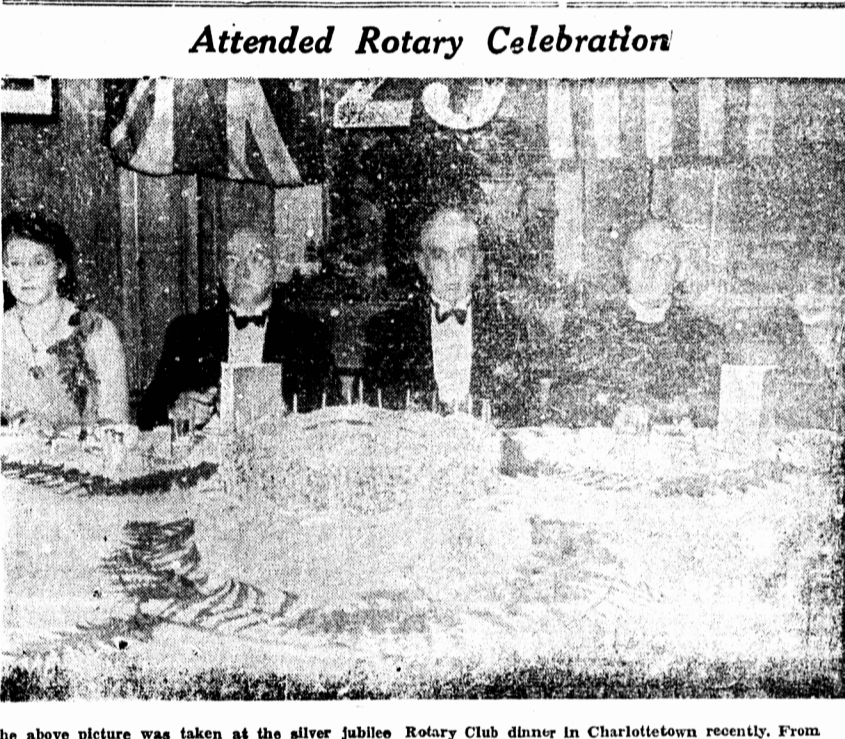
