CALLED TO ARMS IN DEAD OF NIGHT

Wide Awake French Policeman in Little Village Almost Started a European War

If Brigadier Bilion had won back Alsace and Lorraine he could not have placed himself more squarely in the public eye than he did on account of his hurried mobilization of the French troops. This act nearly precipitated a full-fledged European war and sent the Bourses down ten points.

And yet the much-talked-of Brigadier is but an ordinary country policeman who is sergeant of the police of Arricourt, in the district of Luneville, which is situated in that part of the lost Province of Lorraine still belonging to France. Arricourt is only a small town of a few hundred inhabitants. Active, athletic, alert, Bilion owes his temporary fame to the error of a telegraph operator. The War Department sent out telegrams to different centres ordering the troops to go through the exercises of mobilization. These are, of course, as different from actual mobilization as military manoeuvres are from real war. But as the air was filled with war and rumors of war, M. Defaut, the operator who received the telegraph at Arricourt, easily concluded that the telegram was an order for actual mobilization. He lost no time in communicating a very formal order to Brigadier Bilion, with the result that the latter became the most famous man in France.

He Moved Quickly
Brigadier Bilion did not stop to reason whether or not some one had blundered. Although it was half-past twelve at night when the order to mobilize reached him he immediately sent notice to the ten little communes under his jurisdiction. Drums began to beat and bands began to play. Women and children got out of bed to help their husbands, fathers, brothers, and sweethearts to get ready to go to the front. The order of Brigadier Bilion was being executed to the very letter and within a few hours the men were all on their way to join their respective garrisons.

The garrisons at Luneville, Saint Nicholas, Nancy, and Toul could scarcely believe their eyes when they saw men arriving on bicycles, in wagons, and on foot during the small hours of the morning. Brigadier Bilion was questioned by the officers but there was the order clear and unmistakable and he was bound to obey it.

But a counter-order came. Then Brigadier Bilion was similarly prompted. He hastened to stop all he could. The original order had been so promptly obeyed, to the great delight of the police officer, that there were not many to be turned back. Of course, there was much emotion caused by the mistake. But it soon disappeared in view of the rapid response of the Lorraine population to the call of the country.

What Error Showed
French military men say that the error was a happy one, for it proved that the spirit of the people is strong and that patriotism is on the quiver in France. It is claimed that the promptness shown by the people of this remote corner of Lorraine would likewise be visible all over France, should occasion require.

Another curious effect of Brigadier Bilion's promptness was that in the neighboring German villages there was a run on the local banks. The peasants rushed to get their money to hide it away. It is stated that in the industrial locality of Warmsdorf in Germany the brigadier's order caused a loss of two million marks.

BUDGET OF ITEMS FROM OLD LAND

The Lisburn Board of Guardians have granted 72c a week relief to a poor woman who was shown to have been supporting herself and child on tenpence a week.

V.C. Hero to Prison
At the Athlone Petty Sessions Wm. Lennon, an ex-soldier, who won the Victoria Cross during the Boer War, was sentenced to two months' imprisonment for stealing a parcel out of a cart.

Died in 101st Year
The death has occurred at Maloon, Ireland, of Mrs. Margaret Johnston, in her 101st year. The deceased was the widow of the late Mr. John Johnston, Dunarvon, and was able to go about until a few days before her death.

Fatal End to Long Sleep
"Death from pancreatitis, accelerated by gas poisoning," was the verdict of a Belfast coroner's jury in the case of Albert E. Erwin, seventeen. The Erwin family, overcome by gas fumes, slept for forty-two hours, and the deceased died in his sleep.

Perambulator Complaint
Mrs. May McKay and Mrs. Agnes Robinson, summoned at Manchester for obstructing the footpath by wheeling bassinets abreast, were discharged on payment of costs. A policeman stated that a pedestrian complained of having to step into the roadway.

Motor-Boat Fleet for War
A committee representing the Admiralty and three of the leading motor boat clubs are considering the organization of a fleet of privately-owned motor boats to assist the Navy in time of war. There are over 300 motor boats suitable for this purpose around the coast, and a scheme of defence in which these could take part is being discussed.

Titanic Wireless Hero
At a meeting of the Godalming Town Council the presentation was made to the Corporation, on behalf of past and present scholars of Godalming Grammar School, of an oil painting of Jack Phillips, the wireless operator on the Titanic, who was an old scholar, and also a native of Godalming. The presentation was made by Charles Elworthy, until recently the headmaster.

Feeding on Raw Turnip
At the hearing of a charge of child neglect against Michael Campion at Celbridge Petty Sessions, Sergeant Lane stated that the only food he found in the place, which was a laborer's cottage, was a piece of raw turnip, in which were marks of children's teeth. The defendant was found lying in bed, and when questioned he said he got his feet wet in the snow, and had to remain in bed. The case was adjourned for a month to give Campion a chance of doing better.

Child Heroism
A story of the death of two children and the heroism displayed by one of the victims comes from Killycurry, near Dundalk. Four children were amusing themselves at a raft composed of disconnected planks. They were ten years, seven and a half years, nine years, and seven and a half years. The raft had been got together satisfactorily, and Kiernan gave it a shove on to the water. Mullin endeavored to board it, and in doing so slipped into the water. He screamed for assistance, and was about to sink when the little girl Mary Estate jumped into the water and endeavored to rescue him. She was unsuccessful, and both perished. Their companions ran away.

Misdirected Bravery
A farmer named Terry, of Ballymacart, Waterford, found a barrel on the sea beach which was filled with some liquid. He took the barrel home, and while examining its contents with a lighted match the liquid biased up, setting fire to the room. The family at once rushed from the house, but the father, missing one child, made two gallant searches for the little one in the blazing building, sustaining dreadful burns all over the body. It afterwards transpired that the child who was missing was away from the house at the time.

To Bid for Historic Castle
For Castle, Ayr, which formed part of the thirteenth century church of St. John, and within which the Scottish Parliament met in 1315, the year after Bannockburn, to settle the succession of the crown, was offered for sale at Ayr recently, with a reserve price of \$10,000, but there was no offer. At the end of the fifteenth century James IV. used to visit the church and make offerings at the altar, and during the Reformation John Knox preached from the pulpit. Oliver Cromwell, during his sojourn in Scotland, used the building as an armoury, and public indignation was so loud that the Protector proffered substantial monetary assistance (1,000 marks, Scots) towards a new church.

ROYAL HANDYMAN

The Popularity of the Duke of Connaught's Son

No member of the Royal family is more widely known or more popular than is Prince Arthur of Connaught. Therefore, it is no matter for surprise that, when he celebrated his birthday, he is the recipient of congratulatory messages from all parts of the world. His Royal Highness has had an eventful career. He is one of the personal aides-de-camp to the King, and is captain in the 2nd Dragoons (Royal Scots Greys). He saw service in South Africa, has opened exhibitions and bridges, visited agricultural shows, shot big game, and presided over conferences and other gatherings of various descriptions. But it is in connection with his diplomatic missions in many of which he represented the King, that he has come most prominently before the public. Thus, he attended the christening of the heir to the Italian throne and the baptism of the Prince of Asturias in Madrid; he visited Germany to be present at the wedding of the Crown Prince, and, later still, represented the King at the funeral of King Oscar of Sweden.

His mission to Japan, when he intervened the late Emperor with the Order of the Garter and Admiral Togo and Marshal Yamagata with the Order of Merit, was a magnificent success. So popular was he that he brought back with him on his return to London more than seventy cases of presents.

On account of his many activities Prince Arthur has been styled "the handyman of the family." It is related of him that when young he ardently desired to be a clockmaker, and to this day manifests an intense interest in mechanism of every kind.

LOVED HIS VIOLIN

Musicalian Takes His Life Rather Than Lose His Instrument

A poor old starving English musician named William Kelsier played moving airs on his violin while the gas from two open jets filled his wretched apartment with deadly fumes. When the eerie music ceased the man was dead.

This was not the only pathetic feature of his closing hours. It is now disclosed that the man, friendless, penniless, and seventy-eight, had made three journeys from his humble lodging to a pawnbroker's shop, but each time he reached the door he felt too keenly the wrenth of parting with his instrument, and returned home.

Mr. Kelsier, it is said by the other tenants, was a violinist of note in Germany, and had many pupils twenty years ago. He failed in health and spirits when his wife died five years later, and lost his pupils. He was afterwards employed by a violin factory but was told he had passed his usefulness and must go. He had been compelled to sell the valuable violin he had brought from Germany and used all his life, so his employer in pity presented to him an instrument which had been used as a model in the factory.
