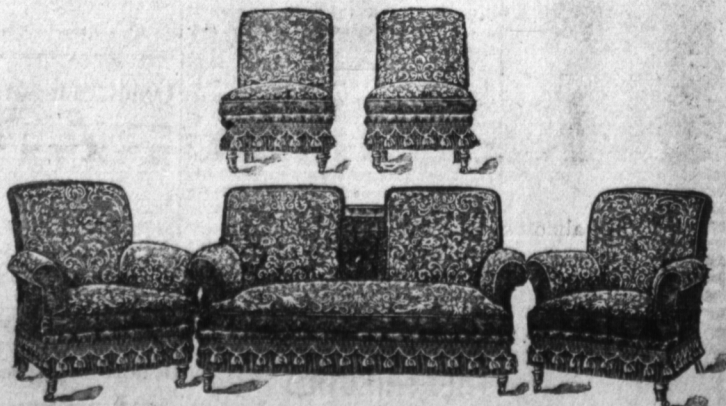

SUMMERSIDE'S DISASTER

The night of 10th October will long be sadly remembered in Summerside as the date of the worst disaster from fire that has yet visited that Town or our Island Province. It was a night of darkness and storm, to which was added a tempest of desolating flame. Beginning almost at the waterside at about ten o'clock the hurricane of devouring fire swept through the residential portion of the town, laying waste the homes, the hotels, the churches and other public edifices. Scores of families were made homeless in a few hours, some of them having lost all their worldly possessions.

A gallant fight was made against this deadly night attack of flame and tempest. All that could be saved was saved, but the loss is very great. One hundred and fifty-five buildings are totally destroyed. The near approach of winter makes the disaster more severely felt than if it had occurred in spring or summer, when partial restoration could have been quickly effected. The property destroyed roughly estimated at \$25,000, takes no account of interrupted business, and the various incidental losses that cannot be measured by a monetary standard.

The greatest sympathy is felt here, throughout the Province and far beyond our shores for the stricken town and we believe that if desired this sympathy would at once take substantial form. Very fortunately the principal mercantile section mainly escaped the fire and will afford a rallying centre for the work of rebuilding. Summerside has been sorely stricken but its citizens are made of the stuff that does not faint in the day of adversity. When the first great shock of the calamity has passed, they will take counsel of their courage and their enterprise to rebuild what was so swiftly destroyed. But the task is of great magnitude.

The rain storm caused the postponement of the races and this together with the return home of a good many western people on account of the Summerside fire, had an unfavorable effect on the attendance at the Exhibition yesterday. Brighter weather and better prospects are in order for today: when the races are to come off.

An Ottawa despatch tells that Hon. A. B. Warburton has been instrumental in securing post offices for Hazelbrook, Hermitage, Ocean View, and Culloden.

There is a suspicion that the Summerside fire may have been of incendiary origin. In this connection the burning of the railway workshops in this city and in Moncton is recalled. In neither case was the origin of the fire disclosed.

Hon James Cumiskey was in communication yesterday with Registrar Campbell of Summerside as to the condition of the vault in the burned court house. The answer was that the vault was presumed to be all right and books and papers secure, although the heat was yet so great to permit of near approach. Registrar White and L. B. McMillan Secretary of Public Works, will go to Summerside this morning to arrange for a temporary court house and registry office until the burned building can be replaced. The Government holds \$5,000 insurance on the burned court house and jail.

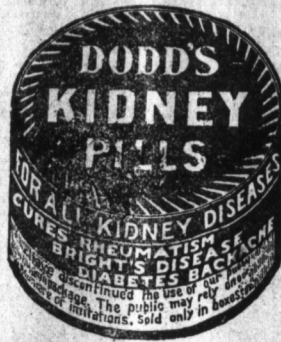

Synopsis of Canadian North HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 36, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 or less, more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

1. If the father or mother, if the father is deceased, of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the homestead as to residence may be satisfied by work, person residing with the father or mother.

2. If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of the homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands of any intention to apply for patent.
