...FARMERS INSTITUTE.—A meeting of the Souris Branch of the Farmer's Institute was held in St. Mary's Hall on Monday, February 23rd. The President, Mr. William Whalen, made a few opening remarks, after which the minutes of the meeting held on the 19th ult. were read and adopted. The President then stated why the meeting was called and said that one of the chief reasons was to consider the forming of an egg circle. He also read a letter from J. J. Hughes & Co., asking for the privilege of collecting the eggs, stating that they were well equipped for this purpose. Mr. Thomas Deenan made a motion that this matter be left over till next night for consideration. This motion was seconded by Frank O. Donnell, and carried. The President then asked if it would be advisable to consider the purchasing of Seeds. After considerable discussion it was moved by Daniel McIsaac and seconded by John Malone, that the matter be left over until after the Seed Fair.

...The question was then asked if it was the intention of the Institute to buy more pure bred stock and if a collector would be taken up for that purpose. The President said that he understood it was the intention to buy more stock, but there was no motion to that effect. As some members thought that Live Stock could be secured cheaper and on easier terms from the Department at Ottawa, the secretary was asked to read and explain the conditions necessary to obtain such stock. After thoroughly discussing the matter, it was moved by Thos. Deenan, seconded by Wilfred Mooney that the Institute purchase a pure-bred Ayshire bull. The motion carried. On the motion of Daniel McIsaac, seconded by Peter Lyons, it was decided that a special collection of fifty cents per member be taken up immediately. After discussing several other matters of minor importance the meeting adjourned.
