—Interesting Display of Old Charlottetown

—OLD TIME PICTURES OF CHARLOTTETOWN ON VIEW AT PROTESTANT ORPHAN-AGE OFFICE, 158 PRINCE STREET

These pictures are the work of the late George Hubbard, whom many will remember and were donated to the Orphanage by the late R. K. Brace.

The first painted in 1849 shows the Government House, the Paymaster's Office, the Barracks, the Magistrate's Office, the Barracks ground, the flagstaff, McLean's cooper shop and dwelling, Pownal Street and the Old Raskin House, Pownal Wharf showing the Ship Castilia and the Brig Fanny, which took the Islanders to California, also the steamer which carried the mails to Pictou, Yates Auction Stand with Mr. Dalrymple leaning against Purdie's warehouse at the head of the wharf and the Catholic Chapel.

The second made by Mr. Hubbard while sitting at the London House Corner (now the Royal Bank) shows the Old Round Market House, the Colonial Building, the Church of England, and the Flour Market (now W. K. Rogers building).

The third painted in 1844 from Thompson's, and shows the building built by Chief Justice Jarvis, the Old Roman Catholic Chapel, on the corner of St. George and Sidney Streets, the Church of England situated where the Court House now stands.

The fourth painted in 1849 shows the Old Kirk, the Roman Catholic Chapel, the Provincial Building, Zion Church, the roof of the Methodist Church and the Church of England.

It was thought that many would like to see these interesting pictures and in fancy quench their thirst at Stamper's Pump; the description given here is very brief for among the many other scenes is a corner of Col. McGill's farm with Miss McGill feeding the hens.

All four pictures will be on display for some time and may be seen between the hours of 11-12 a. m. and 4-5 p. m.
