IN MEMORIAM

THE LATE MR. JOHN COLLINGS.

It is with deep regret that The Guardian to-day announces the death of one of Charlottetown's best known and most respected citizens, in the person of Mr. John Collings. His death was not unexpected, since Mr. Collings had been suffering for some time from heart disease to which he succumbed yesterday. Mr. Collings was a native of Charlottetown and was thirty-four years in the service of the Charlottetown Steam Navigation Company; during the whole period of that service he was Chief Steward of the S. S. "Prince of Wales," the S. S. "Northumberland" and the S. S. "Empress," on which he was last employed. He was popular with the travelling public who will greatly regret his death. Mr. Collings was a member of the St. John's Lodge, A. F. and A. M., which he joined in the year 1883 and of which, in 1888, he was Worshipful Master. He was an energetic and enthusiastic member, and in token of their sympathy and respect the members have raised the flag at half-mast on the Masonic Temple. He was a member of the First Methodist Church, Charlottetown, to which he was always devoutly attached. He leaves to mourn three sons and four daughters besides his wife. His sons are, John, of the P. E. Island Railway, Roy, Jeweller of Sydney, and Harold, of Winnipeg, and the daughters, Miss Estlin, of British Columbia, Mrs. Herbert Augustus, of St. John's, Benjamin Rogers, Charlottetown, and Miss Lillian, at home. Mr. Collings was seventy years old at his death. The funeral will take place on Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock from his residence, Great George Street, to the People's Cemetery, with Masonic ceremony.

EXECUTION OF FOUR GUNMEN
AT EDEN MUSEE, NEW YORK.

For three weeks previous to the execution of the four gunmen at Sing Sing prison, the Eden Musee's entire staff of artists, carpenters, property men were busily engaged getting up a mammoth group depicting the actual scene of the execution the result being that this group is now on exhibition in the Chamber of Horrors at that famous institution.

The group is most interesting inasmuch as very few people have ever witnessed a death scene by electrocution. The group shows the first of the gunmen in the electric chair, while the other three condemned men are waiting to meet their death. The witnesses the Priest, the Warden, the electrician, reporters and others are shown in the group, while the electric chair is an exact reproduction of the one used at Sing Sing. The switch board, dynamo and in fact everything that is necessary to make this a perfect reproduction is shown. Thousands of dollars has been spent on this tableau, which is in keeping up with the up to the minute times of the Musee.
