THE Annual Meeting of the Summerside District was held in Epworth Hall, on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. Rev. Mr. McCully, Chairman of the District, presided. Rev. Mr. Wightman performed the duties of Financial Secretary, Rev. A. D. McLeod and Rev. Geo. Sellar acted as journal secretaries and Rev. H. S. Young as statistical secretary. The reports for the year were encouraging, both as regards spiritual and financial interests. During the year 122 members have been received on probation and 32 by letter, making a total of 154. A large number have removed, however, and many have died, so that the net increase for the year is 10, the total membership in the District, 1701. The amount raised for the several Connectional Funds are as follows:—Missionary \$1020.45, Supernumerary \$194.70, Educational \$73.80, Contingent \$35.00, General Conference \$56.80, Union Church Relief \$9.40, S. S. Aid and Extension \$14.25, Sustentation \$100.85, Childrens \$405.00, Temperance \$14.00, Woman's Missionary \$116.55, General Epworth League \$7.50, making a total for these funds of \$3309.50, an increase of \$377.33 over last year. In addition to this amount the District reports \$4800.00 raised for circuit purposes and \$4513.00 for Minister's salaries, making a grand total raised for all purposes of \$12656.00, an increase over last year of \$1516.33.
