pulse all that he wrote came from that. That struggle to distinguish between what was inspired and what was not inspired in the Bible arose from the struggle to defend certain parts of Holy Scripture from irrational criticism. Dr. Campbell said that there would be found many parts in the Book which could not stand the test of critical analysis both scientifically and historically.

MEXICAN AFFAIRS

(Canadian Press.) EL PASO, Mar. 7.—General Terzetas has until next Sunday to pay the 50,000 Pesos ransom for his son Luis, who is held by the rebel General Villa at Chihuahua. This sum is equal to \$250,000 but the once millionaire of Mexico has not that much left, according to his friends. The letter demanding the money is dated March 3rd and stated if the ransom was not paid within 5 days Luis would be "taken South" with General Villa. This threat to terrorize can be construed in only one way, and that is that his son will fall a victim to the notorious fugitive from law if the money is not forthcoming. Under provision of "Ley Fuga" the prisoner is always shot while trying to escape. General Terzetas is 80 years old and is greatly shaken by the peril to his son. The letter has been a prisoner for several months and already has submitted to extortion of \$650,000 to save him from death. Three years ago the Terzetas fortune was estimated at \$40,000,000.

GOING EAST ON WORK OF CHURCH

VANCOUVER, March 7.—Rev. Dr. Chown, who is at present delivering a series of lectures on "Sociology" before the theological students of Columbian College, will leave next week on an important trip to the east. At Lethbridge he will dedicate a newly erected church. Proceeding to Calgary he will meet the corporation committee of the Methodist and Presbyterian Churches of which he is chairman. The special object of this meeting will be to consider the future work of the two denominations and to so adjust their plans as to avoid overlapping. While at Calgary he will also meet the Alberta conference missionary committee for the purpose of considering the best policy to adopt relative to the work among the Indians in that province. Dr. Milliken, the new president of Regina College, will also be attended by Rev. Dr. Chown in his official capacity. He will deliver an address. Dr. Milliken, well known here as a former pastor of Wesley Church, began his labors as president of Regina College nearly a year ago, but for various reasons his formal installation has been delayed until now. Dr. Chown will, if possible, return to Vancouver by the way of Edmonton and Prince Rupert over the Grand Trunk Pacific. The line not being complete as yet, if he makes that route he will travel one hundred and fifty miles by stage or motor.
