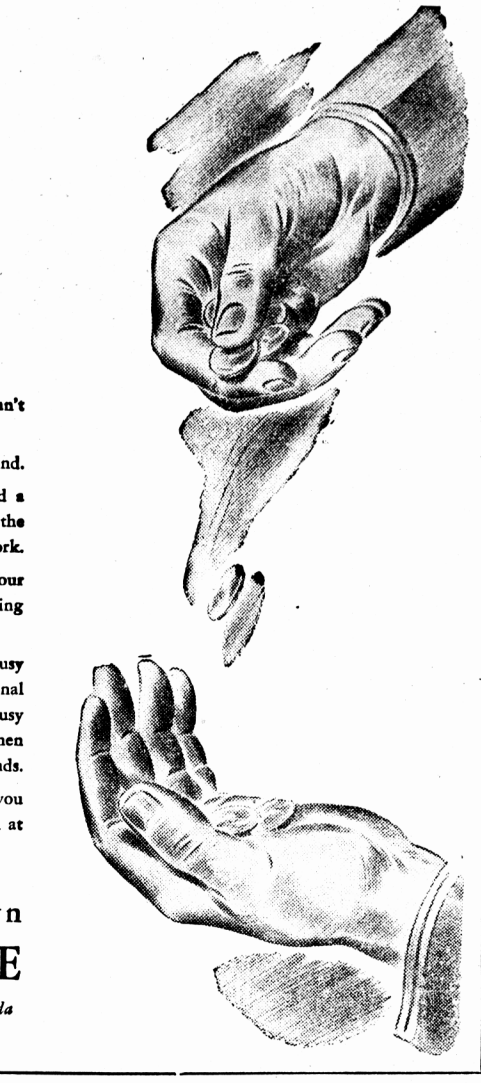

Ontario and Newfoundland were as follows: British Columbia \$3,430,000, Alberta 2,838,000, Saskatchewan 2,548,000, Manitoba 2,807,000, Ontario 21,201,000, Quebec 12,445,000, N.W. Brunswick 1,292,000, Nova Scotia 1,772,000, Prince Edward Island 230,000, Newfoundland 667,000.

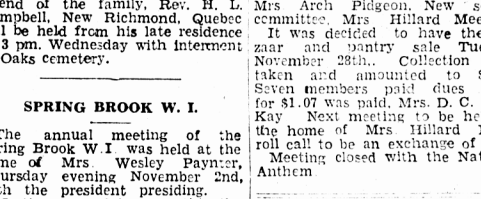
