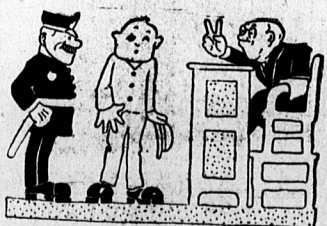

A good deal of attention was attracted on Saturday by the exhibition in the show window of the Two of the Life preserver taken from the body of the late H. J. Allison, Montreal, one of the victims of the Titanic disaster. This was brought to Charlottetown by G. D. Wright, Undertaker, who embalmed the body. There is also shown a belt taken from one of the sailors and a few buttons secured off the coat of one of the heroic handsmen. The window is nicely draped in black with a large Union Jack in the foreground.

Not long since, the many friends of Henry Jones of Hazelbrook made him a genuine surprise in the form of a birthday party. After a good time had been enjoyed by all, the people were called together and Lock Jones, a friend, read an address which made reference to the very high esteem in which Mr. Jones is so deservedly held, as a neighbor, a citizen and a Christian; and on behalf of his many friends presented him with a beautiful Morris chair as a small token of their esteem, and wished both him and his good wife many more years of health and prosperity. Mr. Jones was taken wholly by surprise and feelingly thanked his friends for their kind remembrance.

There was a splendid attendance of three thousand Saturday evening at the Niagara ice rink to witness the sports, which included the mile skating championship. The following were the starters: Hoffmann, Scott, Morley, Kennedy, and Rees. The course had been accurately measured during the afternoon, and was officially certified to be fifteen laps and five yards to the mile. Hoffmann jumped to the front on the word "Go!" and, setting a very hot pace, soon led the field by about half a lap. When half the distance had been covered, Kennedy was seen to be pulling up gradually, and two laps from home succeeded in passing Hoffmann, increasing his lead to about thirty yards, by which margin he won. Rees was the only other competitor to complete the distance. The winner's time was returned at 4min. 9sec. The race caused a great deal of excitement, the winner and second man were heartily applauded. Kennedy skated a magnificently judged race, and received hearty congratulations on his victory from his opponents. He receives an 18-carat gold medal, which is presented by the Friday Skating Club, and will hold the title of Mile Skating Champion of South Africa.—Times, Kimberly, South Africa. (The Kennedy referred to is W. J. Kennedy, son of Alex. Kennedy, Southport. The rink is a new one and cost \$350,000 to erect. His many friends here will be pleased to learn of Mr. Kennedy's success on the blades.)
