THE KAISER GROWS A BEARD.

It has been gravely announced from Berlin that the Kaiser is growing a full beard. It would, we presume, be less majestic to criticize his action in that regard within the bounds of the German Empire. Even at this safe distance and under the protection of the guns of Fort Edward, so to speak, THE GUARDIAN does not raise any objection. We simply note the fact that the Kaiser while acting within the domain of his undoubted prerogatives has done a very significant thing. It is clear that his new departure, if such it may be called, means that hereafter he intends to present a different face to his people and the world from that which he has heretofore presented. His countenance will be changed, visibly and permanently, in its expression and in its adornment. The fierce mustache, turned up at a menacing angle to right and left of the Imperial Nose will not hereafter be so prominent and distinguished a feature. It will be supported below and at either side by beard and whisker of more or less vigorous growth amid which it will repose with imperial complacency.

The Kaiser of the future, in his proper person will be in Shakespearean phrase, as a typical soldier "bearded like a pard." The coins of the realm will so present his image to an admiring people. The statues that are to be, when the Imperial William has achieved greatness, will boldly forth a hirsute Kaiser. History will record that in the first year of a memorable century, and in the thirteenth year of his illustrious reign the Kaiser and the razor deliberately on his part, parted company. Presumably the Imperial Tonsorial Artist will be at once retired upon a pension and his high office abolished. Already we learn that among the initial effects of the change is the fact that the Knights of the Striped Pole are in despair. For be it observed that in a loyal Empire it is fashionably obligatory that as the full beard of the Kaiser emerges on the Imperial visage, millions of beards of subjects leal and true shall also emerge and shall grow with its growth and strengthen with its strength. So great will be the change in the hairy stocracy of Germany in the month to come, and so appalling the loss of trade to all the race of barbers. It will be a close shave if any of them survive.

Moreover, and what is of real consequence, the great change which is coming over the face of the Kaiser and of Germany assures the peace of the world for the immediate future, and also his continued presence at Berlin for weeks or months to come. Imperial William like other mortals cannot grow a full beard in a day. Nor will it befit the Imperial dignity to go forth much in the social circle, or on parade, still less to war, with a stubby beard. He must therefore "tarry at Jericho till his beard is grown." Thus by a paradox his new departure will prevent him from departing from his capital, whether for peace or war, till patient nature has completed the hirsute growth. Probably by the time the autumn manoeuvres come on the new Imperial Beard will be sufficiently mature to be presentable, and then, like a Samson with his locks restored, the Kaiser and War Lord may stand forth before his army and the world to challenge the admiration and the apprehension of the powers. Till then at last we shall have peace.

Again two Irish members of the House of Commons, Redmond and O'Brien, have been named and suspended. The large vote of 203 to 71 would go to show that the suspension was not made without good cause.

AN ELECTION SLANDER AND THE PENALTY.

Both in this country and in the United Kingdom, a very great deal of latitude is permitted in the charges and counter-charges made by candidates against each other. A recent decision of a British Court has, however, shown that for slander uttered during an election campaign the injured party may secure substantial damages. In this case a Mr. Cremer, who was elected as the Liberal member for Haggerston, has been convicted of libel and sentenced to pay £1,000 damages to his opponent for false charges made against him during the election campaign.

Mr. John Lowles was the Conservative candidate in the election and afterward the plaintiff in the action at law. The result of the polling was pretty close, Cremer having a majority of only 24 votes. It was shown during the trial that Lowles would almost certainly have been elected had it not been for the scandalous attack made upon his personal character on behalf of his opponent and that for this attack Cremer was responsible. The essence of the slander was that Lowles had been guilty of embezzlement and financial dishonesty in the settlement of the affairs of an embarrassed firm of merchant tailors. Mr. Lowles established to the satisfaction of the jury that his relations with the firm in question were strictly honest and honorable, and that the story of embezzlement was conjured up for election purposes, privately circulated on the eve of the election too late for successful contradiction, and that the story if not invented by Cremer was circulated with his knowledge, he knowing it to be false.

It is not therefore surprising that the jury found a verdict for the plaintiff, and that the defendant was not only adjudged to pay £1,000 damages, but also to make a public apology to his opponent. Cremer still holds the seat in Parliament, however for the action referred to, was of course not in the election court. It is clear that he ought at once to resign his seat, and should he fail to do this he will be doubtless politically ostracised. It was a very mean and contemptible method by which Cremer gained a seat in the British Commons, but who shall say that sometimes, even in Canada, a seat has not been secured by means equally reprehensible and quite parallel to those referred to?
