Today at 12 o'clock noon, the valuable property, 234 Sydney St., Charlottetown will be sold.

A cottage pleasantly situated on Hillsboro Square, Charlottetown, with modern conveniences, a comfortable home, will be sold at 12 o'clock noon today.

The S. S. Enterprise is expected to arrive in port at Charlottetown next Wednesday, May 1st, on her first trip of the season. She will sail the following day.

The following produce prices were secured on the Charlottetown market square and have prevailed since last Tuesday:—White oats, 56c; black oats 58; potatoes, 60 to 65c; pork, 7 to 8 1/2c; beef (quarter, per lb.), 8 to 10c; beef (small) per lb., 8 to 17c. The prices quoted by the wholesalers are: Potatoes, pressed hay, \$13; white oats, 55c to 58c; black oats, 58 to 60c; pork, 7c to 9c; straw, \$5.50 and turnips 18 to 20.

The tug William Aitken, which left port Thursday morning for Cape Traverse to proceed with effecting repairs to the broken Anglo-American Telegraph Co. cable, returned to port that evening at six o'clock. She had just arrived at Cape Traverse when she was struck by the screw was reported and fearing a loosened propeller, Capt. Batt headed for Charlottetown. Repairs will be effected at this port.

Lieut. INDIANS CLAIMS MUST BE SETTLED.

OTTAWA, April 26—Acquisition of new territory by Ontario and Quebec renders necessary a series of solemn treaty making conferences between Commissioners of the Dominion Government and the chiefs of the Cree, Ojibway and other Indian tribes in Keewatin and Ungava. The reason is that the old Indian title to these lands still holds good and can only be terminated by a treaty under which the red men will get \$5 each. The reserves of some six thousand Indians are affected.
