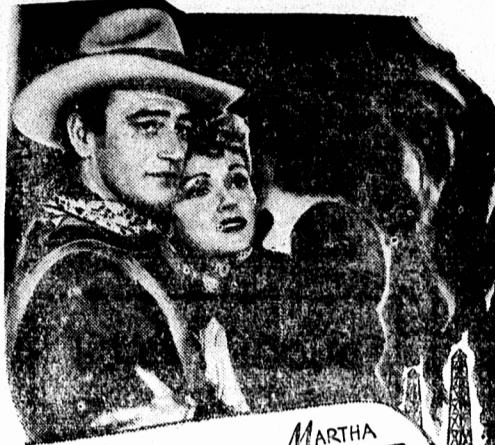

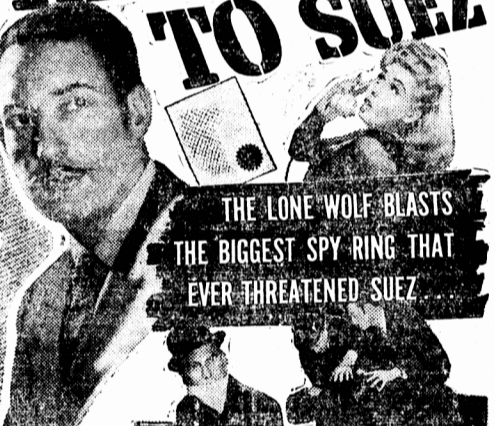
The Special Names Committee of the Red Cross campaign who only received their prospect cards on Wednesday evening already report some splendid successes with large increases by many contributors over last year's givings.
