POTATO BUTTER

In view of the extreme scarcity of butter, the British Food Ministry has

issued a recipe for potato butter which costs less than ten cents a pound, and is said to be very satisfactory. Following is the method for making it: Peel the potatoes and boil until they fall to pieces and become floury. Then rub through a fine sieve into a warmed basin fourteen ounces of potatoes and add two ounces of oleomargarine and one teaspoonful of salt. Stir until smooth and then mould into rolls and keep in a cool place. If the intention is to keep it beyond a few days a butter preservative should be added.
