Says Customs Officer Did Not Do His Duty

Lunenburg Schooner Hispanola Seized at North Sydney Charged With Violating the Customs Law by Failing to Report at Georgetown Last May.

NORTH SYDNEY, November 9.—Charged with violating the customs laws by failing to enter and clear his vessel at Georgetown, Prince Edward Island, last May, the Lunenburg schooner Hispanola, Captain Kennedy, but now owned by Farrel and Sons, St. Lawrence, Newfoundland, was seized upon her arrival yesterday by Captain Gordon, some time ago, received word of the alleged infraction by the Hispanola's skipper, and the moment the latter entered port he immediately went on board and took the skipper's papers. Later on, however, when Captain Kennedy explained the situation, his papers were restored to him on payment of a deposit of \$25, which he expects later on to have returned him.

According to Captain Kennedy, the alleged breach of the customs laws at the island port took place last May, and to a certain extent was unavoidable on his part. At the time drift ice surrounded in great quantities off Georgetown and after securing sufficient amount of bait Captain Ken-

nedly anchored about six miles off the harbor. For the purpose of entering and clearing his vessel, the skipper lowered a boat and rowed the distance of six miles, only to find the custom house closed. This was about four o'clock in the afternoon, and fearing the ice would close in upon his vessel Captain Kennedy decided to row back and get his vessel away from the ice.

He did not, under the circumstances, consider he was doing any great harm, and when boarded here by the revenue cutter's commander, Captain Kennedy naturally felt indignant. However, he does not blame Captain Gordon, who, he says, treated him with every courtesy. "The fault," said Captain Kennedy this morning to your correspondent, "lies with the custom officials at Georgetown. Had he been attending to his business I would not be suffering this annoyance. However, I believe my \$25 will be returned then I will report the Georgetown official's negligence to the department."—Halifax Herald.

RECALLING AN HEROIC INCIDENT THE BIRKENHEAD

Grim Memories Recalled of the Historic Disaster—One of the Finest Incidents in the Annals on the British Army.

LONDON, England, November 9.—This story of splendid discipline and sublime unselfishness has lately been retold by one of the few survivors—ex-Corporal William Smith—who is now nearly eighty years of age.

HERO INTERVIEWED.

Mr. Smith tells the whole story for Lloyd's News in his own words. "I am a native of Eydon, near Northamptonshire where I now live, and enlisted at Weodon in 1848, joined the 12th Foot Regiment."

On January 1, 1852, we went on board the troopship, Birkenhead, which was then lying at Spithead.

"The Kaffir war was on, and as most if not all the regiments for which we had drafts were at the front we only stayed long enough at Simon's Bay, South Africa to take on more troops and stores, sailing from there about six o'clock on the evening of Feb. 25. We had then as we afterwards heard 600 officers rank and file, women and children on board.

SCENES OF CONFUSION.

"About two o'clock in the morning of the 26th, when we were about three miles from the coast, there was a sudden crash shaking the vessel from end to end, and apparently smashing her iron bottom as if it were an egg-shell. For a moment the ship seemed to stagger and stopped, then heeled a few yards, and finally began to settle in the water.

when the 'shock' came. With others I rushed to the ladder leading to the main deck, where, for a moment, there was terrible confusion.

"Orders were being shouted by officers of the ship, other orders by officers of the various Army details. Rockets were being fired upwards to notify passing vessels or those on shore of our need of assistance, and women and children were shrieking and shouting and despairing. It was a scene I should not like to see twice.

"I was 'women and children first, and I must say every man I saw was loyally doing his utmost to see the rule observed.

"When the troops had been got into something like order a party of sixty, of which I was one, was sent to man the pumps.

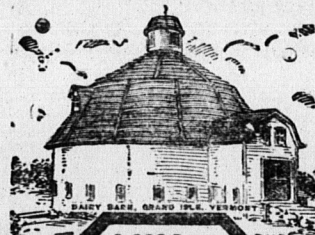

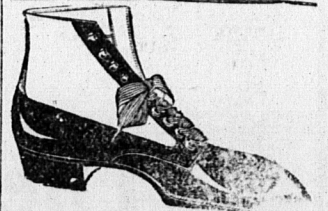
