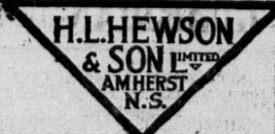

### Opinions Differ On German Elections

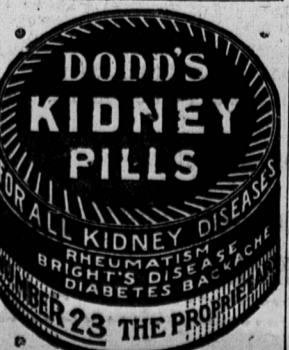
PARIS, June 10.—As yet French newspapers make very little comment on the elections in Germany. Special despatches from Berlin to important newspapers differ. The Journal says there are many more voters this year than at the elections for the First National Assembly. The Petit Parisien, government's official organ, states that fewer Germans are voting than at previous elections and that they appear to be little interested in the next Reichstag.

### GREAT TRADE ROUTES UNDER AMERICAN FLAG

**NEW YORK, June 9.**—Former trade routes of the Hamburg American line, closed in 1914 with the outbreak of the war, are to be promptly reopened with American flag, tonnage supplied by the Harriman interests, it was announced here today at the office of W. A. Harriman and Company Incorporated.

Decision to take over these routes followed negotiations with several representatives of the German company who have been in the United States for a number of weeks "at the request and suggestion of several members of the United States Shipping Board," according to representatives of Harriman and Company.

Coupled with this announcement came a second that Harriman & Company had acquired through purchase substantial blocks of stock of the American Ship & Commerce Corporation which for more than a year has been operating a freight service between New York and Hamburg and utilizing the Hamburg-American Company in Hamburg as its agents. At a meeting of the directors of the American Ship and Commerce Company today Major General George W. Goethals was succeeded as president by W. A. Harriman, S. F. Pryor and Lester H. Monks, representing the Harriman interests, were chosen as directors.

The agreement whereby American tonnage is to be supplied to reopen the former German service holds for 20 years, and Harriman & Company is to turn over to the American Ship & Commerce Corporation the agreement made with the representatives of the German line. This agreement, it was said, is now subject only to minor details of adjustment. It also was announced by Harriman & Company and by Chandler & Company who organized the American Ship and Commerce Navigation Company, that all ships owned by their affiliate interests "fly the American flag and are owned by American corporations in which there is no German interests direct or indirect."
