ARREARS OF TAXES

NOTICE TO DEFAULTERS

Notice is hereby given that the Act passed by the Legislature in 1907, to provide a more speedy and simple method for the collection of Arrears of Taxes, will be put into force at once for the collection of Arrears of 1906 and all previous years. The new Act does not require proceedings to be taken against the land, the advertising of the same, nor the making of Final Notices to Defaulters, and it gives the Government the additional power, after the Taxes are one month over due, of selling in any Court, and of levying on all goods and chattels found on the premises or in possession of the party sued. Where there are no goods and chattels, or not sufficient to levy on, proceedings will be taken against the land under the old Act as heretofore.

Report of G. Scribe of Grand Division

Submitted at the Recent Quarterly Session Held in Charlottetown—Interesting Statistics and General Information

One of the most important items of the past quarter has been the consideration of the Prohibition Law, which on the whole is fairly satisfactory. But we cannot forget soon the narrow escape, the danger and the necessity for a measure, which if it were not for the liquor traffic new laws, and a longer lease of life. This cannot be looked upon as a fair carrying out of the announced policy of the present Government. Instead of providing simply for the enforcement of the present system, and a more effective law enforcement, the new amendments had proposed to give the liquor traffic more latitude than it now has. It would have taken away from the power of the people, and would have led to the suppression of the liquor traffic, and if added to the Prohibition Law, would only tend to increase drinking, drunkenness and disorder. It looks as if the voice of the liquor man, is being followed in some instances. Several amendments were undertaken to decide the whole question for the time being.
