Find "Starvation Diet" Not Enough

BRISTOL, England, April 24 — (CP) — After five days on an experimental "starvation diet" of 4000 calories a day, W.P. Vernon, Labor member of Parliament, reported today that he felt "definitely weaker."

But a British U.N.R.R.A. director said Vernon's diet "is hardly a true comparison with starving continental countries" because the diet "is getting essential vitamins which are lacking in the monotonous diet in parts of Europe."

He is living on a daily allowance of 11 ounces of bread, four ounces of skimmed milk, ½ ounce each of meat, sugar and margarine, and 2½ ounces of green vegetables.
