**CHINESE REPUBLIC IS RECOGNIZED**

**U. S. to Take Long Promised Action—Reception at Winter Palace.**

PEKIN, May 6 (Special).—The United States will recognize the republic of China tomorrow. The Chinese government will testify to its appreciation by an elaborate reception and luncheon to the legation staff at the Winter Palace.

Before Secretary Bryan left Washington for California, he announced that Mr. Williams, chargé d'affaires at Pekin, had been instructed to extend formal recognition to the new republic of China as soon as the constituent assembly had been properly organized in all its branches and provision made for the election of administrative officers.

At that time it was expected these preliminaries would occupy only a few days, but party divisions sprang up in the lower branch of the legislature which resulted in deferring until yesterday the completion of the work of organization.

It is expected that following this recognition, a new Minister to China, accredited to the republic, will be designated to succeed Mr. Calhoun, who is now on his way home. Mr. Chang, the resident Minister of China, probably soon will receive credentials from Yuan Shih-kai, the provisional President of China, in place of the credentials issued to him by the late Manchu government.

**NATIONAL COUNCIL IN MONTREAL**

 MONTREAL, May 5.—The afternoon session of the National Council of Women was full of interesting matter. The delegates were first given an opportunity to inspect the milk station which is operated under the auspices of the Montreal Council of Women and where pure milk is supplied for use of babies at a nominal cost, if given outright to families which are too poor to buy it.

Mothers' meetings were also held in the milk station where addresses were given on the care of children—

Following the inspection, Dr. J. Gadami of McGill gave a helpful address on child welfare. Social service and social efficiency were discussed by Miss Helen Read, Director of the social service Dept. of the Victorian order of nurses.

Following the addresses tea was served by the Montreal Irish Women's Club.

**MILITANT SUFFRAGETTE IN AEROPLANE**

LONDON, May 6 (Special)—The militant suffragettes are conspiring to convey Mrs. Pankhurst out of England by aeroplane. Several prominent airmen at Hendon have been requested to undertake the enterprise.

Miss Annie Kenney, one of the most prominent of the militant suffragettes, was arrested as soon as she set foot in England on her arrival from the Continent. A detective had accompanied her from Paris bearing a warrant charging her with conspiracy.

Miss Kenney was brought up at the Bow Street Police Station and remanded by the magistrate, who refused to grant bail.

Mrs. O. H. P. Belmont, of New York, before leaving for Paris, said:—"The British government learns nothing from history. The present coercive measures against the suffragettes are bound to fail."

The campaign of arson was continued when a large stable at Hendon, a northwestern suburb of London, was set on fire and practically destroyed. A placard with the words "Votes! Votes! Votes! Beware!" was found pasted on the premises.

The debate on the second reading of the women's suffrage bill began in the House of Commons on Monday.

In order to avoid a repetition of the heated scenes which occurred last session between Mr. Lewis Harcourt and Mr. Lloyd-George, only two ministers shall speak on the bill—the Prime Minister, Mr. Asquith, against, and the Foreign Secretary, Sir Edward Grey, for the measure.

The Duchess of Bedford, in a published statement, expresses the opinion that a much larger body of English women than is supposed want the franchise, but are afraid to declare themselves publicly for fear of being identified with militancy.

**A NEW INDUSTRY.**

TORONTO, May 5.—A local real estate firm is looking for a location for one of the largest news print manufacturing plants in the States. The Act wiping out the duty on white news paper which has yet to be passed by the United States Senate, will, according to the statement of a man connected with this big New York company, cause the concern to remove all its plants to Canada.

This country now supplies the bigger part of the pulp wood made in paper in the States, and it is figured that with the duty barrier down, American firms, to keep their business, must make paper in Canada.

This particular company wants a big site, either at Toronto or Hamilton, for certain branches of its work. It also plans to erect one big mill in New Brunswick.

**COMMITTED TO SUPREME COURT.**

AMHERST, N. S., May 5.—The preliminary examination of Charles Watt, alleged child murderer, was concluded late Friday afternoon. Only one witness was called, J. L. Simpson, whose evidence tended to corroborate that of E. M. Lockwood as to the accused buying chloroform in the Cumberland drug store on the Friday previous to the crime.

The question of the competency of Mrs. Watt as a witness against her husband was argued for several hours by Mr. R. K. Smith, but Stipendiary MacKenzie intimated that he would prefer to have a judge of the supreme court decide the point, and committed the man for trial before the supreme court, which will meet here in June. There has been no word of the missing child.

**STEWED CHICKEN**

Take a chicken or fowl weighing about four pounds, one onion chopped fine, one tablespoonful of chopped parsley, one tablespoonful of salt, one-half teaspoonful of thyme, one-half teaspoonful of ground ginger, one-quarter of a teaspoonful of mace and one-quarter of a teaspoonful of pepper.

Cut the chicken into pieces suitable for serving, wash it and put it in a saucepan, cover it with water and set it on to boil. When boiling add the onion, parsley and the spices. Cook it slowly for three hours or until tender and about one-half hour before serving thicken it with three tablespoonfuls of browned flour and enough liquor from the stew to mix the flour. Be careful not to have it lumpy. When well mixed pour it into the stew and let it simmer for a half hour. Garnish with rice and sprigs of parsley.
