Winnipeg Grain
WINNIPEG, Aug. 22—(CP)—Liberal hedging sales representing new crop deliveries, came into oats and barley trade Saturday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange and prices generally were lower.
Buying by American houses interested appeared in both grains, particularly in barley, on the recessions but prices closed around their lows for the day.
Hedging sales also appeared in 77½ futures trading, with occasional buying by seaboard interests coming in on the decline.
Flax trade was light with some selling by local elevator interests. Small demand appeared spasmodically.
Class two wheat prices were reduced two cents from Friday.

Fodder Corn
(Experimental Farms News)
Prior to 1939 very little corn was grown in Prince Edward Island and much of that sown was too late maturing for Island conditions. Immediate success followed the introduction of suitable varieties and corn is now being grown as a supplementary forage crop on most dairy farms. Almost every year there is a period in late summer and early fall when pastures become dry, and milk production falls off unless some form of succulent feed is provided.
Annual pasture and late seeded oats for green feed are useful during the early part of the period, but corn and white-fleshed turnips are preferable during the latter part. Corn, like turnips, produces large quantities of feed and the nature of its maturity is such that it is suitable for feeding over an extended period. The feeding value of corn increases rapidly between the silking out stage and maturity and it is therefore advisable to plant an early and later maturing variety. Canada No. 240 has proved useful as an early maturing variety for Prince Edward Island conditions, while Algonquin, a later and more productive hybrid, is most satisfactory for feeding the late part of the season, says W.N. Black, Supervisor of Illustration Stations, Dominion Experimental Station, Charlottetown, P.E.I.
Corn for fodder should be planted in close proximity to the stable or in a field immediately adjoining the pasture area where it may be readily accessible to livestock.
For fall feeding, corn may be planted with an ordinary drill seeder in rows ranging from 28 to 36 inches apart or in hills 2 or 3 feet apart in the row, depending on the seedling quality of the forage desired. When grown as a silage crop a thicker seeding is preferable in order that finer

Weekly Market Report
SUMMARY
Improved quality in the cattle offering, coupled with considerable speculative buying, served to send prices to higher levels in the past week. Advances of 50¢ to \$1.50 were general, with western markets showing the most upturn. Calf prices were firm to stronger, lambs generally easier, hogs up 50¢ at Toronto but down a like amount at Montreal, and unchanged elsewhere.
Eastern Cattle Markets
Eastern cattle prices were up a general 50¢, with spots in the market showing an advance of fully \$1.00. An unprecedented top of \$26 was reached at Toronto but only for a small lot of yearlings shipped from Peterboro County. The top on weighty steers was \$24 as against last week's \$23, with butcher steers grating up to \$22. Good stocker material was also in demand at steady prices, with some short-cut feeders up to \$18.25. Everything was cleared at prices firm to 50¢ higher at Montreal, the best of the steers making \$19 to \$21 and good cows \$13 to \$14.50; while the Marimines quoted top steers at \$16 to \$17, f.o.b.

Western Cattle Markets
Keen competition was evident throughout western markets, with buyers taking everything at their disposal and mostly at prices from 50¢ to \$1.50 above the previous week. Supplies were well cleared, with Winnipeg having a small number of choice steers at a top of \$23.50, others from \$23 down, while good feeder material enjoyed a brisk enquiry at \$15 to \$17. Calgary advanced about \$1.00, principally on account of speculative buying, and some top steers moved at \$24, with good to choice generally \$22.50 to \$23.50. Edmonton moved up 50¢ and had some weighty steers at \$21.50, with grassers \$20 down. Prince Albert \$21; Moose Jaw mostly \$16 to \$17 for mediums; Saskatoon \$19 to \$20; Regina \$20; and Vancouver \$20 to \$22.

Crop Report
WINNIPEG, MAN., Aug. 20—Harvesting which had commenced in early sown crop in the three Prairie Provinces, has been held up this past week by widespread rains. The added precipitation will assist in good filling of the crop, which is already apparent, but will delay maturity of later sown crops. Another two to three weeks without frost will be required if they are to be successfully harvested. Fall damage is reported from several points, the heaviest occurring at Deloraine in Southern Manitoba which ranged from 10 to 80 percent. In this section, some flax fields were so damaged that they had to be ploughed under, according to the weekly crop report of the Department of Agriculture of the Canadian National Railways.
stalks producing a large amount of green forage may result. When seeded too thickly, corn often develops coarse stalks which are not readily eaten.
Corn is a strong feeder and requires good land for best results. Care should be exercised to avoid severe burning by frost in the late fall as frost injury will reduce the palatability and feeding value of the crop. This loss may be avoided by shocking in large stacks when frost is imminent.
