Threatening Niagara.

The Buffalo exposition has raised the question again as to the possibility of exhausting the falls of Niagara by artificial means. It appears that the celebrated English scientist, Lord Kelvin said in Toronto some years ago, after a visit to the falls: "I look forward to the time when the whole water from Lake Erie will find its way to the lower level of Lake Ontario through machinery doing more good for the world than the great benefit which we now possess in the contemplation of the splendid scene which we have presented before us." Mr. Thomas A. Edison who has recently been to Buffalo and Niagara, with an eye to the same subject, finds large manufacturing operations in progress about the falls and prophesies that here is to be a great manufacturing and electro-chemical centre; but he fixes limits to its area, and thinks the power thus obtained is not likely to be extended very far beyond that point. When asked as regards this latter he was emphatic in expressing a negative opinion, declaring tersely that there is "no money in it." Mr. Edison apparently finds practical obstacles not anticipated in Lord Kelvin's vision of the future.
